

From the Desk of Father Gonser

The 2010 Catholic Charities Appeal has begun in all of the parishes of our diocese. The homilies this week will be focused on the importance of this appeal. Next week will be pledge week. Many have already received their campaign cards in the mail. Next week will be an opportunity for everyone to make a pledge, if they have not already done so by mail. Our goal for this year is \$27,000. I have every confidence that we will reach this and even exceed it. Our parish's generosity for the needy is well known. Everyone makes sacrifices for the needy, not only for our parish but throughout the diocese. May our Lord bless us as we sacrifice for the welfare of our community.

I am very happy to report that all of our class rooms have been re-carpeted. JLA Floors Inc. from Avon, which is owned by one of our parishioners Michael Orsagos, has done the work. The original carpet has been in there since 1980. This will make a marked improvement in the building. In the past year we have had some significant upgrades in the building, ceiling fans in all the classrooms, electrical upgrades in the kitchen and new exhaust fans all done by Don Jirousek. As part of our planned maintenance we have replaced three original furnaces with high energy gas furnaces and will replace the other three over the next two years. I am grateful to our maintenance staff, Joyce Laska, Don Moran and Dick Gosselin for the high quality of work they do in our buildings. Your support of our finances, especially in the Capital Improvement envelope, has helped greatly in paying for the parish building upgrades. This spring and summer we will be focusing on landscaping, especially upgrading the gardens. We are looking for volunteers to assist in this project. We are very grateful to Michelle Vilagi for her many years of service to St. Julie's as the head of the Garden Angels. She is taking a well deserved retirement from this ministry. Both she and I will be glad to help anyone who is interested in this ministry that produces such beauty and atmosphere for the whole parish and community.

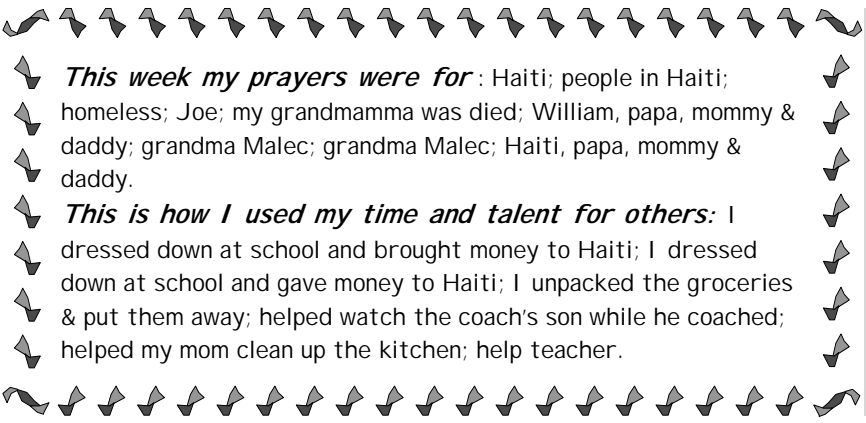
