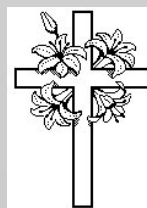

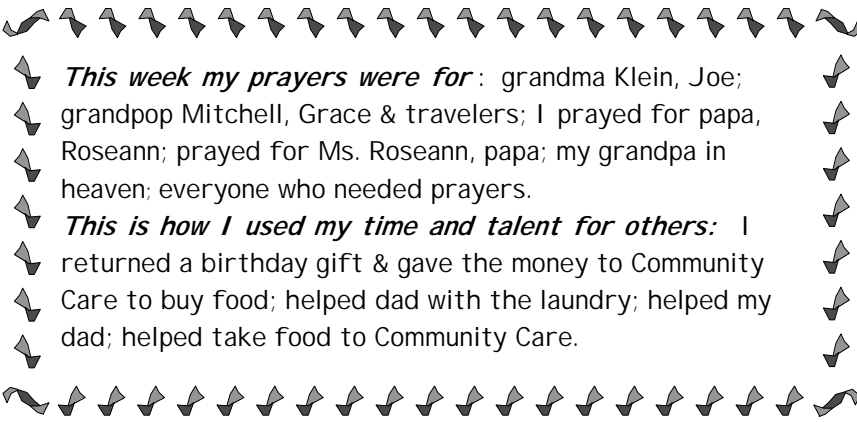



Happy Easter! We are so thrilled that you chose to celebrate the Easter Liturgy with our St. Julie's Community. As we celebrate the most important day in our Catholic Church, we might be drawn to think about all our children, friends, and relatives who for some reason have decided that Mass is not for them. Some of these people have real and hurtful reasons why they are not active Catholics. Our Church certainly is an institution of imperfection. Deep hurts may be caused from: church closings, contraception, divorce, priest scandals, sexual orientation or sacramental preparation. It is an historical church, where greatness and failure have made it endure and prosper, being led by the Holy Spirit.

Our answer to all of our imperfections is that we have one absolutely pure and PERFECT gift that no other religion or faith can claim, and that is Holy Eucharist. It is a mystery of faith, where Jesus is truly alive in His Body and Blood. This part of the Mass not only recalls the sacrifices of the past, but brings them fully in the present. Maybe, this point of view may help in conversation, where you might feel helpless in sharing your faith. Pray for ways that truths of the Eucharist may be revealed to you, so it can be passed on to the future generations.
