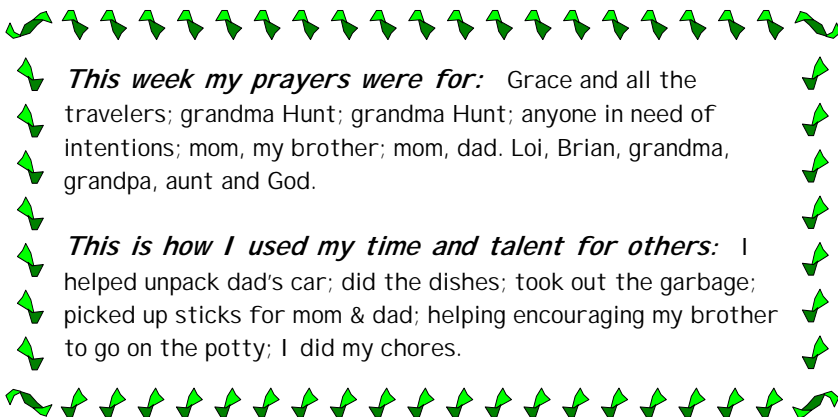
### PrimeTimers
