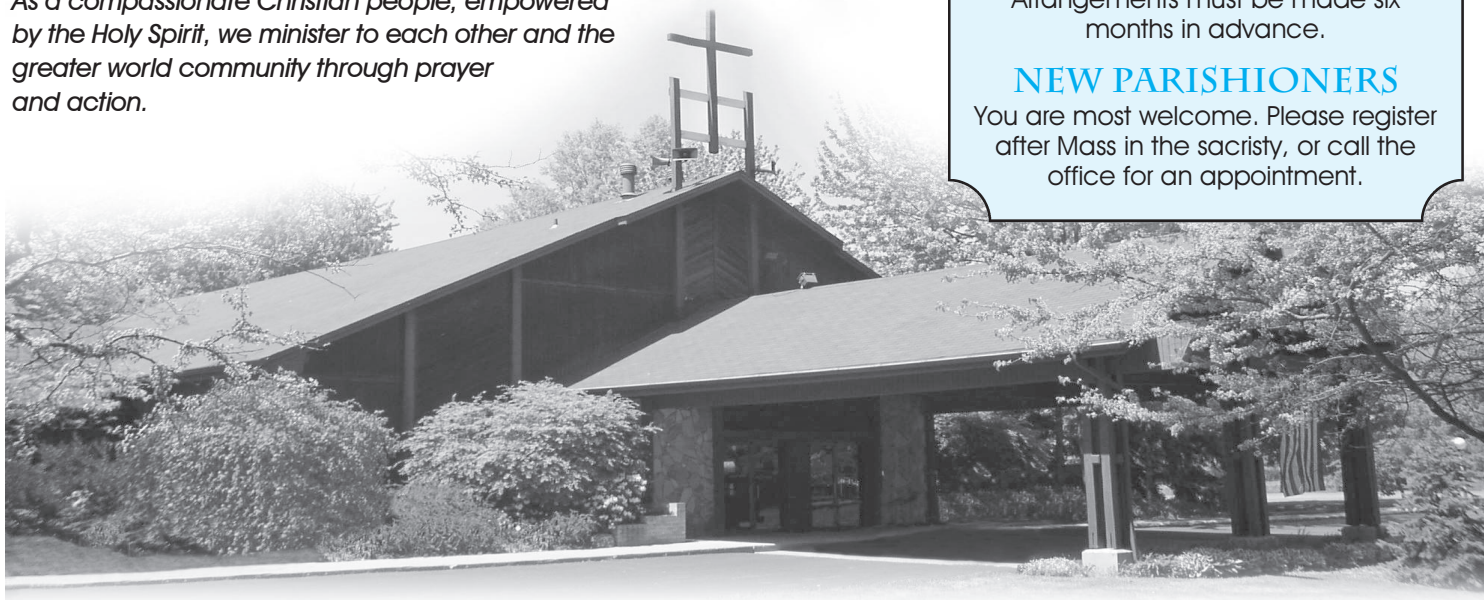

## From the Desk of Father Gonser

Tuesday, November 1, the Feast of All Saints, is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be at the Church at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Come and celebrate our real heroes, men and women who were ordinary people but lived lives of extraordinary faith, hope and love. No one starts out in life planning to be a saint, yet we are all called to follow Christ and be all that we can be. Sanctity is accepting the challenge of discipline, commitment and singleness of purpose which is to imitate Christ by loving Him and loving our neighbor. Check out the lives of the saints from books in our parish library. Many men and women such as John Paul II, Mother Theresa, St. Theresa of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi are examples of men and women who were focused totally on becoming the best person they could be in the eyes of God. In an age of mediocrity, materialism and moral ambiguity the call to holiness is critical for all of us to embrace. Holiness of life will inspire others to goodness rather than long speeches, powerful armies and material possessions. "Come follow Me," says Jesus to all of us and learn of Him for He is meek and humble of heart. Remember St. Paul says we are God's chosen people, a holy nation called by God to participate in His life and mission.
