

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioner,

This is Christ the King Sunday. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas Primas (which translates In the first...). He recognized that taking Christ and his law out of public life would lead to more strife and chaos in our world.

The world was just recovering from WW I. Mexico, Russia and parts of Europe had adopted secularistic forms of government hostile to the Church, as well as people and civilization in general. The Pope's desire was that people would put Christ first, above nation states. He recognized, even as the Church has proclaimed for centuries, nationalism without God would lead to more strife, conflict, and bloodshed. Though the feast day was implemented, the message was not. The twentieth century was marked by war and violence in an unprecedented way.

And needless to say, this violence has spilled into the 21st Century, with the 9/11 attacks, wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and now in Ukraine and the Holy Land.

Can we make a difference for greater peace in our world? Many years ago, there was a popular bumper sticker that read *Visualize World Peace*. Some people, seeing the folly of trying to make peace a reality by visualizing it, created a counter bumper sticker. It showed a whisk and peas and read *Visualize Whirled Peas*. World peace will be furthered, not through visualization, but by living justly and charitably.

I believe the difference we can make for peace begins by crowning Christ as King of our own lives. By inviting him to rule our values, our choices, our speech, our time, our resources, He can bring greater peace into our lives and then into this world.

Today's gospel passage on this Feast of Christ the King gives us direction in making Jesus the ruler of our lives. It depicts the final judgement. And it seemed that many people were a bit surprised as Jesus gathered them and divided them into two groups. Jesus told them that whatever they did or did not do for the least and the lost, they did or did not do for him! For many, this was an eye-opening moment. Some were pleasantly surprised, and others were horribly shocked.

The direction that we can take, not only to increase peace in our world, but to save our souls, must move toward charity. It is when we forget ourselves and serve others, that we prepare ourselves for the eternal life the Christ has prepared for us.

As we enter the holiday season, may the Lord direct our charity. This can be as simple as going to the Giving Tree located in the St. Julie vestibule. May the Lord direct our hearts to grow in charity toward the least and the lost. **Final thought:** I am looking to hire someone to food shop and cook for Fr. Isidore and me at St. Peter Parish. I am anticipating this to be around ten hours a week. Normally this would not involve serving food. Fr. Isidore and I would heat up the meals and clean up the kitchen. 

JESSE TREE

During Advent St. Julie's will be using a Jesse Tree to remember that we are waiting for Jesus. Each Sunday we will be adding ornaments to our tree as we follow God's plan for our salvation from Creation to the birth of Jesus.

The Jesse Tree comes from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse Tree with illustrated ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus.

The Jesse Tree is a way of telling the story of God's plan from the beginning of time to redeem His people by sending a Savior. It follows the lineage of Christ's family and key people in the Old Testament that God uses to tell His story from Creation through Christ's birth. It tells the story of God's people waiting for their King to arrive.

Making a Jesse Tree can help set our hearts on the true meaning of Christmas. This historical Christmas tradition dates back to the Middle Ages and acts as an Advent activity to remind both children and adults of the events leading up to Jesus' birth.

If you would like to put an ornament on the Jessee Tree at the beginning of Mass, or read a short verse about the ornament, please sign up in the vestibule. Moms and Dads, older brothers and sisters, or anyone else, can read a verse or add ornaments.

St. Julie parishioners will be adding ornaments at all Masses every weekend in December. Signup sheets are at the back of church, or Ushers will ask for volunteers before Mass.
