Dear Parishioners

Like most of you, the passing of Pope Francis on Easter Monday surprised me. After an earlier than normal Easter dinner with family, I tuned into the national evening news that evening. Part of the news included Pope Francis being the Pope: blessing the world on Easter and being whisked around St. Peter's Square in the Popemobile. He even welcomed Vice-President Vance and his wife earlier on Easter Day.

In September of 2015 Pope Francis visited Cuba, Canada, and the United States. I took a weekend off and went to Philadelphia to participate in his visit to the City of Brotherly Love. The highlight was the Papal Mass that Sunday afternoon, which took place in a large park in front of the Philadelphia Museum of Art (think of the stairs that Rocky runs up in the movie). It was attended by hundreds of thousands of Catholics.

After Mass I had a somewhat close encounter with Pope Francis. Several of us priests were finding our way back to the museum (the staging area for the priests) when we were stopped at small side street. Sure enough, the Pope's motorcade was passing by. The window was down, and we got a close-up wave from Pope Francis.

The passing of the Pope is a special time of prayer for the Church. We commend to the mercy of God the soul of Pope Francis and pray that he rests in peace. It is also a time of praying for the next Pope. May the new Pope be an instrument of God's coming Kingdom, helping all of us do the will of God in our daily lives.

I want to thank everyone who helped make Holy Week and Easter a prayerful and joyful time. I am also grateful for the music of Mary Pokrywka and our choir, who accompanied our Holy Week liturgies. Finally, I am grateful to Beth Paoloni and the liturgical environment team who helped decorate the church. The Church environment shouts: Jesus is risen from the dead! We also want to congratulate and welcome Dale Chan, who has been attending St. Julie Parish for several years and took the plunge on Easter at St. Peter Parish. He was baptized, confirmed, and made his first Holy Communion.

I heard that the 9:00 a.m. Easter Mass was rather "alarming." To minimize the possibility of inadvertently setting off the smoke alarm again, we will be learning preventative measures and trying a different kind of incense that dissipates quicker.


We have several important liturgical celebrations this week, beginning with the Divine Mercy Holy Hour this afternoon at 3:00 p.m. This will take place at St. Peter Parish. I invite you to join me as we spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament and the image of Jesus, Divine Mercy.

On Tuesday of this week, Bishop Malesic will be here at St. Peter Parish to confirm 50 young people of which 10 are St. Julie Parish eighth graders. I am grateful to Jill Papesh, a St. Julie parishioner who oversees the Confirmation preparation program for both parishes. Come Holy Spirit! May our Confirmandii live ever more deeply by the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit.

We have a few of capital improvement projects that are being lined up for St. Julie Parish. I have a fully executed contract (signed by Bishop Malesic) with SBS Construction to renovate the bedroom area of St. Julie rectory. I am hoping that this can begin immediately. At the church, we are looking to replace the concrete walkway from the parking lot to the entrance of the church. It has served well for over 40 years. However, it is cracked and uneven. The second project on the church grounds will be installing a video security system. We hope to complete these projects in a timely manner.

Finally, on this Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, our gospel story tells of the eighth day after the resurrection, which focuses on the Apostle Thomas. With so much skepticism in our day, St. Thomas the Apostle can be our special patron. The Lord had special mercy on him. Thomas moved quickly from "I will never believe..." to "My Lord and my God!" May his confession of Jesus as Lord and God quide our lives.

The Pilgrimage for Justice is a faith-based, intercultural, intergenerational immersion experience for pilgrims to travel, learn, reflect, pray, and grow as we rediscover Civil Rights history. The pilgrimage will depart from Cleveland and visit Cincinnati, Memphis, Jackson, and Montgomery.

EVENT DETAILS:

The Pilgrimage for Justice is \$1,195.00 per participant, which includes bus transportation, overnight double-occupancy accommodations, site visit fees, and most meals and \$1,495 per participant for single-occupancy. Space is limited. Participation is confirmed only after submitting your registration form with a down payment of \$400.00 or full payment of registration fees.



During his visit to Australia in November of 1986, Pope St. John Paul II made reference to St. Augustine in these words, "We Are Easter People and Alleluia is our song!" He then added, "We are not looking for a shallow joy but rather a joy that comes from faith, that grows through unselfish love, that respects the fundamental duty of love of neighbor, without which it would be unbecoming to speak of Joy."

Our "Pilgrimage for Justice" 2025 is a contemporary experience of authentic Easter joy that comes from faith rooted in unselfish love, and a public witness to the fundamental duty of love of neighbor. We will travel as pilgrims by coach bus, conscious that there is a significant difference between a religious pilgrimage and a vacation, or even a sightseeing tour.
