





Dear brothers in Christ,

It is with great joy that I share with you the news that Pope Francis has appointed one of our own as an auxiliary bishop for the diocese. The Holy Father has appointed Father Michael Woost to be our new auxiliary bishop. Bishop-elect Woost will be ordained to the episcopate on Thursday, August 4, 2022 at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. Together with all of you we extend our heartfelt congratulations to him.

A native of Cleveland, Bishop-elect Woost graduated from St. Ignatius High School and attended Borromeo and Saint Mary Seminaries. He was ordained to the priesthood for service in the Diocese of Cleveland in 1984. After ordination, he was assigned as parochial vicar at Immaculate Conception Parish in Madison, where he served until being appointed to the diocesan Vocation Office, where he co-directed from 1988-1995. Bishop-elect Woost then began graduate studies at the Catholic University of America. After earning a licentiate in sacred theology in 2000, he joined the faculty at Saint Mary Seminary and Graduate School of theology, where he still teaches sacramental-liturgical theology.

This announcement is great news for the Diocese of Cleveland. I am grateful to the Holy Father Pope Francis for the appointment of Bishop-elect Woost as an auxiliary bishop. He is a highly respected, capable, and faithful man who will be a good helpmate with me in shepherding the wonderful people of our Diocese. I look forward to working closely with Bishop-elect Woost and ask you, along with all of the faithful, to pray for him as he prepares to be ordained as a bishop of our Church.


May the God of all Goodness bless and guide him in his episcopal ministry.







Dear God, help me to love my friends like Jesus did.










I will take three cans of food to the church for the poor.
