

# St. Julie Billiart Parish

#### Dear Parishioners,

I think I can safely say that the Universal Church was universally surprised when Cardinal Robert Prevost was elected the successor of Peter, the new Pope Leo XIV. I am grateful for the role of the Pope in the Church as well as in the world. Please join me in continuing to pray that his labors make the Church more fruitful as we proclaim Jesus as Lord until His return.

Asbestos abatement of the St. Peter rectory is tentatively scheduled for the week of June 2 or 9. Abatement should take a week. Demolition of that rectory will follow around June 16. Fr. Isidore and I will be moving into the rectory at St. Julie Parish just before abatement.

**Renovation of the St. Julie Rectory began this week**. The renovation (moving walls, painting, and flooring in the bedroom areas) should be completed in three weeks. Pray that Fr. Isidore and I get packed!

The St. Julie Garden Committee met last Saturday. We discussed the various flower beds around the church, Lear Nagel Road, and Julie Lane. I believe there were six gardeners present representing a total of seven people. I am still recruiting gardeners. All new gardeners will be able to share in the dinner that we have planned for July.

A week from Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, is Memorial Day. Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. at St. Peter Parish only. Weather permitting, the Mass will be celebrated next to the St. Peter Cemetery, next to the parish offices. All are welcome. St. Julie Parish will be the site for Mass on July 4 and Labor Day.

**Our gospel this week focuses on love**. However, Jesus calls this path his "new commandment." Why is it a *new* commandment? Isn't the commandment *Love your neighbor as yourself* already in the Old Testament? (It is-Leviticus 19:18.) The commandment of Jesus is *new* because:

- Jesus said, As I have loved you, so you must love each other. Jesus washed his disciples' feet and forgave his persecutors from the cross. He continues to give himself completely to us in the Eucharist. This self-forgetful generosity is to become our new way of loving!
- Jesus gives us new power in the Holy Spirit so that we can fulfill this commandment, for the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit... (Romans 5:5)
- The love of Jesus is patient. As Pope Francis said, The Lord never tires of forgiving. We tire of asking! Let us never tire of asking God or forgiving our neighbor.

# O God, source of all patience and encouragement (Romans 15:4), teach us love like Jesus!

If we learn to do so, we will become saints. And the world will be a better place!



## Parish Pastoral Council Nominations A New Process

The Diocese of Cleveland has issued new norms for Parish Pastoral Councils. Here are three paragraphs from these new norms:

> 4. The council's primary purpose is to assist the pastor in discerning the pastoral direction of the parish in light of both the Bishop's and the larger Church's vision of parish life.

5. The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative and advisory, not deliberative body, which provides the pastor with insights perspective and guidance on the issues affecting the pastoral life of the parish.

8. (b) Elections for membership of the council are not permitted. However, the pastor may invite parishioners prayerfully to share the names of members of the community to serve on council, in addition to inviting members to serve on his own initiative.

St. Julie Parish is implementing these norms this year. We will not be having elections. However, Fr. Bob Franco welcomes nominations. You may nominate a parishioner or yourself. He will be in contact with you. Nominations are due on Wednesday, May 28.
