Dear Parishioners,

We just finished a week of Vacation Bible School. With the theme Scuba, our young people learned that God is faithful and loving. We can trust Him during the storms of life and, by loving each other, we help each other through. I want to thank Niki Sherman and her team of adult and teen volunteers for making this event possible. I was gratified at seeing many of our young people leading groups and making Scuba a success. God bless all who made 2024 VBS possible.

St. Peter and St. Julie home information sharing program is officially underway. Over thirty volunteers will be dropping off purple bags to each registered household in both St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes. These bags will contain information about the Sacraments and the activities of our parishes. When they come to your home, please welcome them. However, do not detain them. They have many bags to drop off! We pray that the seeds they sow will bear good fruit.

Though the infamous Roe v. Wade decision has been overturned, the issue of abortion is more relevant than ever. Considering this, Lorain County Right to Life is continuing their signature ad and billboard campaign. Members of the St. Julie Pro-Life group will be in the back of the church to collect your signature and receive your donations after all the Masses today.

The Cycling Saints took to the road for the first time last week. Bill Johanson is organizing it this summer. Our next ride is scheduled for Sunday, September 8. We will get that information out in a timely manner for those who want to join our group for a 15-to-20-mile bike ride on a Sunday afternoon.

Last Sunday the Church began a five-week plunge into John 6. Drawing a parallel between the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fish and the miracle of changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, I addressed the obligation we have as Catholics to participating in the Eucharist each week and Holy Day. My topic this week will be Where we find life.

This weekend's gospel describes the aftermath of Jesus' miracle. The people who were fed by this miracle came looking for Jesus. They had all sorts of questions. However, Jesus went to the heart of the matter. He told them, Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you.

Some of the slang words for things that deal with money include words related to food: dough, clams, cheddar, cheese, and breadwinner. We know that when we have money, we will have food. However, Jesus reminded us that we do not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. How does God's word nourish us? Quite simply, the truth of God gives us meaning. Yes, physical bread sustains us. However, God's truth, among other things, tells us why we are here. Let us seek that bread that sustains us to eternal life.




