

Dear Parishioner,

On Wednesday, February 28 (just after last week's bulletin deadline) I heard confessions nonstop for three hours and forty minutes. Fr. Isidore heard confessions for over two hours here at St. Julie Parish. We are both grateful for the turnout and are glad to be dispensers of God's mercy.

If you did not take advantage of that opportunity, <u>St. Peter</u> <u>Parish is hosting</u> the joint Penance Service with St. Julie Parish this Sunday, March 10th at 3:00 p.m., All are more than welcome! What a great opportunity to get right with the Lord!

Also, this Sunday evening, Fr. Isidore and I will be celebrating the Sacrament of Penance with the St. Julie PSR Students. Pray that this will be a wonderful encounter for them with the forgiving mercy of Jesus.

I will also be recruiting Altar Servers that night. I want to rebuild the serving crew here at St. Julie Parish. If you have a child, grade four or older, who is interested in serving at the altar, please contact me and I will share with you the permission form and training dates.

Friday and Saturday of this past week was the Willie Wonka, Jr. play put on by the students of St. Peter School. I know that Mr. Brooks, the school faculty and staff, and of course our students have worked months on this production. I am grateful for all their hard work. This kind of theatrical production teaches students poise and teamwork. These life skills, coupled with the spiritual foundation and academic excellence of our school, make St. Peter School a great place for students. I am grateful to Mr. Brooks for his leadership in bringing the theater to St. Peter School.

Next Sunday is St. Patrick's Day. I pray that we can celebrate this day like they do in Ireland: they close the bars, and all go to church. (At least that's what they used to do. I am not sure about their current practice.) Please include the Holy Mass in your St. Patrick's Day celebrations.

Our readings for the Fourth Sunday of Lent (cycle B) touch on some of the lowest and highest interventions of God. From the Second Book of Chronicles, the author describes destruction of Jerusalem and the exiling of God's people to Babylon. This is one of the lowest points in the history of God's people. The author is very clear why this tragedy took place: people rejected God and his ways as well as his messengers!

The gospel gives us God's amazing solution-His Son Jesus! He is the apex of God's interventions! However, St. John even warns us in this passage-people can still reject the light. They can choose to love darkness more than light.

In our second reading, St. Paul highlights our response to the good news. We are to accept the gift of faith and grace that saves us. And then live according. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works, that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them. (Ephesians 2:10)

May these words inspire our Lenten practices of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting.

Week 4 Update

We are now in Week 4 of the 40 Days for Life Spring Campaign, and there's exciting news to share: We know of 76 babies whose lives have been saved from abortion! Praise God!! This also means that 76 moms and dads were spared the pain and suffering of participating in the death of their own child. Your prayers are making a difference! Keep praying!

Around the U.S. and around the world, children are being saved from death by abortion because people are praying. Here's an account of how prayer (and a creative sign) saved the life of a child in Rockford, Illinois:

A young, sullen-looking couple arrived at the abortion facility in Rockford and took a LONG look at the sign held by 40 Days for Life participants. The sign depicted an adorable little boy wearing a bowtie, an illustration of an unborn baby, and the message, "That Was Me...When I was a Whole Lot Younger." The abortion-bound parents entered the facility anyway--but they didn't stay long! A few minutes later, the parents exited, informed sidewalk counselors that they decided against abortion, and took some photos of the sign that saved their baby's life. "The couple was filled with joy, happiness, and life, and they even stayed for a few minutes with the sidewalk counselor," wrote Kevin, the Rockford 40 Days for Life leader. "All praise and thanks to our Lord Jesus and thank you to all involved with 40 Days for Life around the world and in Rockford."



Our Entire Life Matiers

What a blessing to see how God is hearing and answering the prayers of His people! Please pray for this mom and dad, and all the moms and dads who choose life. Often the circumstances that brought them to the abortion facility are waiting for them when they return home. This is why prayers are so critical, and also why the amazing services provided by the pregnancy help centers are so important (for a list of local pregnancy help service centers, see <u>stjuliebilliart.org/moms-in-need</u>.)

This Thursday, you can join with fellow St. Julie Billiart parishioners to pray at the Planned Parenthood abortion mill in Bedford Heights from 12noon to 1pm. Our prayers, at the very place where babies are being killed, provide God an opportunity to work in and through us for the benefit of all who enter. Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am.

If you can't make it to Planned Parenthood, you can pray with fellow parishioners in the church, also on Thursday from 12noon to 1pm.

Another opportunity for prayer is to join with the St. Julie Billiart Rosary Group to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm in the church, followed by Eucharistic Adoration from 2-5pm.

Each Monday, St. Peter Church participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm at the Preterm abortion facility and simultaneously at St. Peter Church. Those going to Preterm leave at 11:10 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot and return at 1:45 PM. Those praying at St Peter Church meet there at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.
