Dear Parishioners,

Our gospel reading: Jesus was in the stern, asleep on a cushion. They woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" He woke up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Quiet! Be still!" The wind ceased and there was great calm. Mark 4:38-39

Can faith help us to overcome/fight fear? Jesus' sleeping presence on the storm-tossed sea reveals to us the sleeping faith of his disciples who easily forgot about his power. They should have trusted Him, instead they feared for their lives even though their Lord Jesus was with them in the boat. They failed to demonstrate expectant faith in their hour of need. The Lord Jesus is ever present to us when we call Him while in lake/ocean/river travelling, swimming, fishing or enjoying summer. He is with us on the road, at work (office industries and factories.) school/college, in church. Like Jesus disciples, all of us will experience some challenges in life. What shall be our approach? St. Julie Billiart PSR Survey Results

St. Julie's PSR Program recently conducted a survey to get input on preferred times and PSR format options for the 2024-2025 school year. We currently have 33 PSR families. Families were invited to respond to the survey at the last PSR mass with a verbal announcement and flier sent home with children. This was followed up with family emails and a bulletin insert. 52% of our PSR families responded to the survey. The survey was focused on three issues: PSR format, PSR time, and the need for PSR volunteers.

First, parishioners were asked in the survey if they were interested in two alternate PSR formats, PSR Intensive Summer Camp, and Family Home PSR. 16.7% of respondents were interested in a PSR Summer Program, and 38.9% were interested in a Homeschooling Program.

The second focus of the survey was the preferred time for PSR. Times offered were Sunday morning at 9:30-10:15 or Sunday evening 6:30-7:45. The results showed 6:30-7:45 p.m. was preferred by mostly families with older students with 27.8% of total responses, and 9:30-10:45 a.m. was preferred by 72% of survey respondents.

The final focus of the survey was asking for PSR volunteers. The responses provided for 3 substitute volunteers, 1 assistant volunteer, 1 teacher volunteer, and 66.7% were not interested in volunteering at this time.

Based on the survey results, St. Julie's PSR Program will run 9:30-10:45 a.m. for grades 1-7, and 8th grade confirmation will be Sunday evening 6:30-7:45 p.m. More information on Family Home PSR will be available soon.

Needed: a third-grade teacher, a fourth-grade teacher, and a seventh-grade co-teacher. We also can use anyone interested in being a substitute. Contact Kelly Reed or St. Julie's office.

Registration must be completed by July 31 for families to have their books in time for the start of PSR.
