Dear Parishioners.

I want to begin this column with a "Praise Report." I praise God for last Sunday's procession with the Blessed Sacrament from St. Peter to St. Julie Parish. I am grateful for the people who made this happen: Cheryle Koberna, Ceil Morrison, and Beth Paoloni who organized the details, for the North Ridgeville Police Department who assisted with street crossing, the North Ridgeville City Schools who provided school bus transportation after the procession, Bill Boomer who provided music at St. Julie Parish when the procession arrived, for Tom Fumich who set up our prayer stations along the procession route, for those who provided hospitality at St. Julie's, for those who joined in the procession and finally, for the Lord who granted us good weather to do this procession.

Later that day I was at a couple of graduation parties for high school students and talked about our processions. I heard that other churches had planned a procession with the Blessed Sacrament but moved it indoors due to weather issues. I was grateful for the dry window we had in the early afternoon that allowed us to bring the Most Blessed Sacrament of Jesus Christ through both commercial and residential areas of North Ridgeville. May our witness to the Lord strengthen our faith and bring His blessing to our city.

And once again I ask you to dig a little deeper into this week's bulletin and find the details on our upcoming Jesus and the Eucharist video series, prepared by the National Eucharistic Revival team and the Augustine Institute. The wonderfully prepared series will be both inspirational and enlightening. The weather is good and the fellowship even better. All are welcome. And if you miss a week or two because you will be away, fret not. Just come.

Next weekend on Saturday, June 15, the St. Julie Prayer Ministry team will be offering prayers for healing and other needs after the 5:00 p.m. Mass. The process is very simple. If you want to be prayed with, simply go to the Holy Family Room. Two parishioners will pray with you. They will ask you what you want prayer for and if they could lay their hand on your shoulders. One person will pray aloud. The other person will pray in silence. People have asked for prayers for physical healing, family issues, and other needs. Jesus said, Ask and you will receive...the sick on whom you lay your hands shall be cured. All are welcome.

Our readings highlight two hot topics. The first topic of interest is the devil. Though there are some "materialists" in the world (only material reality exists-nothing spiritual) or even believers who deny the existence of the devil, the Judeo-Christian tradition (and actually most religions in the world) affirm the existence of a malevolent spiritual being who opposes God and His plan. And human beings are the target of his attacks. Though the devil hates God, this evil entity cannot get to God. So, the devil goes after those made in God's image: us!

However, God did not abandon us to sin, death, and Satan when we sinned. In the coming of Jesus Christ, God has come to liberate us. Our first reading gives us what Christian tradition has called the protoevangelium, a Latin word that means first gospel proclamation. For the offspring of the woman will strike at your head (Satan's head) while you strike at his heel. (Genesis 3:15). It speaks of the offspring, Jesus Christ born of Mary, crushing (another translation of the Hebrew) the head of Satan while being struck (His crucifixion) by Satan.

In the gospel, Jesus took the scribes to task. In their envy of Jesus, they accused him of using demonic power to defeat demons. Jesus pointed out how illogical that was. Without saying it directly, Jesus proved himself to be the stronger One who has tied up the devil and is liberating those who were his plunder. What words of hope! In Christ we have true liberty! As for blaspheming the Holy Spirit: this refers to those who attribute Christ's saving power to the devil. As long as you describe the cure as the poison, you cannot be healed. However, if you acknowledge that Jesus does really liberate and save, then you can be forgiven and healed.

The second hot topic is the family: In the beginning of today's gospel passage, Jesus' family came to seize him for they thought he was deranged. At the end of the gospel, Jesus says that our spiritual bonds are more lasting than even our physical ones. If we do the will of God, we are the family of Jesus. And if we put Jesus Christ first in our families and seek God's will, we are bound in love by both familial and spiritual bonds.

Parish Outreach

During Jesus' ministry, He went from place to place spreading the good news of God's love, grace, and healing mercy. He went from town to town, challenging people to rise above their current circumstances with a strong faith in God. He reminded His disciples to remember Him in the breaking of the bread. He calls us to do the same.

This summer, St. Julie and St. Peter parishes will begin a program that will give you a chance to "Follow Him." Teams of parishioners from both churches will distribute pre-made packages of materials reminding registered Catholics from our two parishes, that Jesus is fully present in the Eucharist, and is waiting to share God's great love with them.

We have 2,600 families registered as members of our two parishes. We need people to go out in teams of two to distribute a bag of information to each household. This will be done over a 2-month period. No deep conversations are required. You don't even have to go in anyone's house. Just knock on the door, say hello, and give them the packet. A short training session will get teams ready for the task.

urkey and Syria are situated in a region that experiences frequent, major earthquakes. In early February 2023, central Turkey's most powerful earthquake since 1939 struck with a magnitude of 7.8. More than 10,000 aftershocks continued for weeks afterward, including a powerful magnitude 6.4 aftershock that struck the biblical city of Antioch, known as Antakya. More than 50,000 people in Turkey and neighboring Syria were killed by the initial earthquake, followed by more deaths and the destruction of structures damaged by the first earthquake. UN officials estimated that more than 1.5 million people were left homeless in what is believed to be the largest natural disaster in Turkey's history.

In a mid-February meeting with Turkey's new ambassador to the Holy See, Pope Francis asked what sort of aid Turkey most needed. Within 24 hours, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner and prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Service of Charity, organized a shipment of canned food, diapers, thermal garments, and other necessities, to be sent from Rome to a warehouse in Turkey for distribution to those in need. At the same time, economic aid to Syrian victims was entrusted to the apostolic nunciature in Syria. In addition to this material relief, the Vatican's prefect for the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, visited Syria and Turkey to provide a ministry of presence to victims.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, the poor, and those affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you
