

#### From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioner,

Over the last two weeks I presented the financial reports for St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes. This weekend Fr. Isidore and I are taking some time to talk about stewardship, in particular stewardship of time and talent. (The rollout of *FaithDirect*, the online giving program, will take place on the weekend of October 7-8.)

Churches, organizations and even businesses have been negatively impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. Though the pandemic has been officially over for quite some time, many people have not re-engaged with their parishes and other activities.

This weekend both St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes are making an intentional effort to involve people at our parishes in activities and ministries that help our parish make Jesus Christ present. You will be given time to look over and fill out a form during Mass. Many different ways of serving our parish are listed on the form. There may be a way you want to serve the parish that is not listed on the form. Great! Put it down.

I know at St. Julie Parish, we have a need for more ushers and church decorators. And though this is not written down on the form, we could probably use some more people to work with livestreaming and running our new projection system.

I am well aware that the vocation of the laity is in the world. You are the "front lines" of the Church (according to Pope Pius XII), bringing Christ into your local spheres of influence. However, there are places in the local parish that need a portion of your time and talent, so as to serve your brothers and sisters in the parish. May the Lord bless your service to the Lord: in your neighborhoods, workplaces, homes, and in our parish! Thank you.

Last Sunday, St. Julie Parish was blessed to host a concert by Sanctuary. This local musical group (from St. Mary of the Falls in Olmsted Falls) truly testify to the goodness of family life and the power of faith in Jesus Christ. I believe all who attended were edified by their music and witness. And thank you Greg Dubecky, for opening and closing the building for the concert.

Last week media outlets reported on the Diocese of Cleveland's Parish and School Policy on Issues of Sexuality and Gender Identity. And I have received some questions from parishioners. In order to better answer those questions, the Policy and a FAQ article are available on our website.

The policy addresses some serious and challenging issues. I see these issues as serious and challenging for two reasons. First, sex is personal. It is wrapped up in our identity. Sex is easy to make jokes about but difficult to have a serious dialogue about.

The second reason that these issues are challenging is because some people turn issues of sexuality and gender identity into strongly adversarial conversations. If someone raises questions about modern gender identity theory, those persons are often called bigoted, hateful, and discriminatory. Putting people on the defensive shuts down conversation. It can easily become a shouting match.

#### 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I think there is a name for this: bullying. We do our best to teach our children at home and in school settings not to bully other people. However, adults are pretty good at bullying. And perhaps we need to relearn the art of conversation without accusation and name calling.

I plan on downloading or purchasing the book called The Genesis of Gender by Dr. Abigail Favale (Ignatius Press) this week. Dr. Favale traces the origins of modern gender theories and articulates a Christian vision of the human person. I will let you know what I discovered. If anyone is interested in doing a book study on this book, please let me know.

### WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?

#### THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

#### THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

#### **PUTS WOMEN AT RISK**

Current Ohio laws\* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

#### ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,\*\* "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

#### IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

#### **ARTICLE I, SECTION 22**

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.
