

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners

The Easter Season is a time for the Church to unpack the graces given to believers through Jesus Christ, crucified and raised from the dead. The readings on Sundays and weekdays describe the reality of the resurrection of Christ as well as how his victory touches us. We hear of the sacraments of baptism and penance. We prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and tap into the grace of the Holy Spirit gave us in Confirmation.

Our gospel reading today gives us a beautiful sketch of the celebration of the Eucharist. On the road to Emmaus, Jesus explained the Sacred Scriptures to downcast disciples. He then made Himself known in the breaking of the bread. Isn't this the rhythm of the Mass? We are fed by the Word of God and then communion with Jesus Christ, really and truly present under the appearances of bread and wine in the Eucharist.

I pray that as we continue this journey of Eucharistic revival with Catholics throughout our nation, that our hearts burn with truth and love as we take in God's word and that we can recognize and adore Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

- 1. As we celebrate our faith in Jesus Christ raised from the dead at Sunday Mass, I pray that we can practice our faith in intentional ways throughout the week. If you are looking for some ways to get involved in the church, here are some ways: Walking with Moms in Need: With the overturning of Roe v. Wade early last summer, there are more women who have need of prenatal care and assistance. St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes are partnering to form a team of people who can assist pregnant women in need. Those needs will vary. However, we want to be able to connect women with resources (prenatal care, baby clothes, transportation, support, and accompaniment) that will help them. There will be a meeting at St. Julie Parish this Wednesday, April 26 at 7:00 p.m. at the St. Julie Rectory located at 5455 Opal St. All are welcome.
- 2. Pre-Baptism Program: Catholics desiring to have their first child baptized are to take a Pre-Baptism program. This one evening program is on the last Wednesday of the month and alternates between St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes. The program this month is on Wednesday, April 26 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Julie's Church (5500 Lear Nagle Rd.) Please register by calling St. Peter Parish at (440-327-2201).
- 3. Adopt-a-Highway: This Saturday, April 29, the St. Peter Adopt-a-Highway team will be out picking up litter. If you are able to assist this Saturday morning, please contact Matt Bahar (mbahar99@charter.net or 440-281-8444). The St. Peter adopted highway is Avon-Belden Rd (Hwy 83), between Butternut Ridge Rd. and Hwy 82. In his letter on the environment, Laudato Si, Pope Francis calls all of us to take better care of our common home, the Earth, that is being spoiled by our "throwaway culture." Right to Life Signature and Billboard Ads

The ads will now appear in June to celebrate the anniversary of the June 24, 2022 Dobbs decision that overturned Roe v Wade and returned the ability to restrict abortion to the people of the U.S. The Ad Campaign will promote respect for all life and will include print ads, online messaging, and billboards around Lorain County. Pro-abortion organizations are proposing to enshrine abortion through all nine months of pregnancy into the Ohio Constitution, which would also deny parents any involvement in the abortions of their underage daughters, and would force taxpayers to pay for all abortions. 
