Dear Parishioners,

I was grateful that both St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes were able to celebrate one Mass in North Ridgeville for Independence Day. We will be gathering again for Labor Day as a Catholic community for Mass again at St. Julie's. Though it is not set in stone, the Ridgeville Catholic Youth group is planning on a Pancake Breakfast after the Labor Day Mass. Thanksgiving Day will migrate to St. Peter Parish this year.

This Saturday evening at the St. Julie's 5:00 p.m. Mass, Eric Granakis, a parishioner of St. Julie Parish, will be initiated into the Catholic Church with Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. Eric has had a circuitous route into the Catholic Church. We welcome him and pray that he continues to mature in his Catholic faith.

This note about Eric gives me the opportunity to invite others to consider becoming Catholic Christians. Sr. Sean is organizing the Order of Christian Initiation at St. Peter Parish this summer. If you or someone you know is interested in the Catholic faith, call the St. Peter office (440-327-2201), or check out the St. Peter's website. Calling upon the graces of your own Confirmation, do not be afraid to extend an invitation to someone to the OCIA process at St. Peter Parish.

Just a reminder: the Sacrament of Penance is no longer celebrated after the 8:15 a.m. Mass on Fridays at St. Peter Parish. Confessions will now be heard after the 8:15 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays at St. Peter's. Fr. Isidore and I will normally be there gladly dispensing the Mercy of God. All are welcome.

This Wednesday I will be joining hundreds of people from our Diocese in participating at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana. Jessica Angelo from St. Julie's will be part of this group. The event is expected to draw tens of thousands of participants from around our nation.

This Congress is part of the three-year initiative of our bishops to reinvigorate the faith of Catholics regarding the Eucharist. It is my hope that through these three years of prayer, study, and witnessing, faithful Catholics will have their faith in the real and true presence of Jesus deepened. This is why we have had book studies on the Eucharist this year. It is also why we are presenting the <u>Jesus and the Eucharist</u> series at both parishes.

My greatest hope of this three-year process is that Catholics who have fallen out of the weekly practice of attending Mass would be so stirred up that they would return to confessions and the Eucharist. I realize that there are obstacles to embracing the faith in our day: the clergy sex abuse scandal, the pervasive secularization of our times, and the busyness of our lives. However, Jesus Christ is more important. We need to help others "hurdle" these obstacles and by our love, let nothing get in the way of their relationship with Jesus.

One way I pray that this hope of mine will be fulfilled will be by contacting the registered parishioners of our two parishes with an information package about our parishes, as well as about the Mass and sacraments. Your labors are needed to fulfill this task. The simple training sessions will be taking place at the end of this month (July 22, 23, 29, 30). Attendance at one of these sessions will give you a vision of what we are doing and equip you for this task. See the bulletin for details. In today's gospel, Jesus sent out his disciples two by two to proclaim God's Kingdom. I pray that many of us will hear His call and bring the good news by simply delivering the message by distributing a bag of Catholic information to our registered parishioners. See you on the streets of North Ridgeville.

Ukraine Welcome Committee Update

It is hard to believe that we are only 6 months into our journey with the Bryiovskyis. We have achieved a lot together.

The boys finished the school term June 21st and went to a church camp for a week. Daniel, Artur and Suisanna are all enjoying all the sports for which you have so generously provided equipment. One of the favorite pastimes for the whole family is swimming. Another donation allowed them to get a family pass to all the public pools in Parma. They take advantage of that as often as they can.

Both Vitalii and Nadiia now have their Ohio Driver licenses! They still have the use a car from Vitalii's brother, but Vitalii took a big step this past month. Using his pay from his job at the logistics company and with some help from his boss, he was able to buy a car from a salvage yard. The car needs a lot of work but, since Vitalii was a mechanic in Ukraine, he will be able to make the repairs himself over the next months.

We are very happy that he took this initiative to plan ahead for when his brother will need his car back. We continue to explore the options to get Vitalii a CDL license to allow him to get a position that not only allows him to use his mechanical skills, but also opens the option of truck driving. This process has been more challenging than anticipated.

We are also exploring ideas with Nadiia to use her sewing skills to help support the family needs. This past week, we had a couple of challenges at the house because the A/C went out and then there was a backup in the basement from the storm sewer. Our landlord was very responsive to both issues. We made a great team with the family doing a lot of "bailing" until the plumber could get there. The only "casualty" was an area rug in the basement. We are hoping a good cleaning will resolve that.

It is hard to explain how grateful the family is for all the help we have given. We are truly a team giving "A Hand Up and Not a Hand Out."
