


### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

### From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

This past week St. Julie Parish hosted the combined Vacation Bible School. Overseen by a team of 20 plus adults and teens, the VBS program had 40 children. It was entitled Stellar. As advertised, this VBS program rockets kids to an out of this world adventure, highlighting Jesus Christ, the Light of the World (John 8:12). I am grateful for Kelly Reed, Erin Madden and all the team members who labored to make this an enjoyable teaching event for our youth. May we all better reflect Jesus, the Light, to the world by our good deeds.

You may have never heard of Heraclitus (Greek philosopher who hailed from Ephesus around 500 BC). However, you may have heard him quoted and perhaps even quoted him yourself. **He famously said**, "The only constant in life is change."

The staff of St. Peter Parish will be changing this summer. Erin Madden, the Director of Youth Ministry, will be taking a position at another Catholic parish. Erin will be joining the staff of Assumption Parish in Broadview Heights. She accepted a position of Director of Communications. This certainly fits in with her college major (Communications). It will shorten her commute and free up her evenings.

Though this change at St. Peter Parish does not directly affect St. Julie Parish, I put it out there as in case there is anyone who may be interested in work as a Youth Minister. People interested in youth ministry at St. Peter Parish can find a job posting at Diocese of Cleveland website.

I spoke with Mary Malbasa earlier this week. For those who may not know or remember, Mike and Mary Malbasa led the music ministry for the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturdays for many years. After Danny O'Brien was hired by St. Julie's, they continued to sing and play with the 5:00 choir. They have agreed to resume playing and leading the choir at the 5:00 Mass until a replacement is found. I am grateful for willingness to serve the people of God at St. Julie Parish. Thank you, Mike and Mary!

There is a special election on August 8 in Ohio. This election is to vote on Issue 1, which raises the threshold for changing our state constitution from 50% plus 1 vote to a 60% vote of the electorate. Making this change to the constitutional process in Ohio will help make the process more robust for changing our state constitution. A "Yes" vote on Issue 1 would make it more difficult for groups outside of Ohio from pushing through their proposed amendment to Ohio's constitution in November, which would eliminate parental consent in abortion decisions for minors, make abortion available for all nine months of pregnancy and force Pro-Life groups to refer people for abortions. In this week's newspaper The Elyria Chronicle Telegram there was an editorial lamenting the money from outside the state coming in to promote the passage of Issue 1. However, it did not mention the money coming from outside the state to defeat Issue 1! Lots of money and lots of rhetoric! There will be more of the same in November.

I pray that our votes can count for life in every election, even in this August 8 election. Voting to protect the unborn is not so much a religious issue as it is a human issue. Let us vote to protect both child and mother in all elections.

Our readings this week are very agrarian! Appropriate for this summertime growing season. However, Jesus is teaching us that we must become his fruitful disciples. This means that our souls need to become good ground. We need to guard our minds from becoming a hardened path on which every distraction keeps us from embracing the message of Jesus Christ. We must pull out the rocks of fear and weeds of worry and inordinate pleasure. Lord, make us good ground for the Word of Life!


