

Dear Parishioner,

Last Sunday, right after the 11:00 a.m. Mass, the St. Julie St. Peter Ukrainian Welcome Circle gathered to honor volunteers who have supported this ministry. And there is much to celebrate. Under the leadership of Terry Flanagan, Chris Vacca and Dean Morrison the Welcome Circle researched and carefully laid a solid foundation to assist a family who is fleeing the ravages of war-torn Ukraine. After fundraising, house hunting, and donation collecting we were connected with the Bryiovsky family, who are now settled in their home in Parma.

I am grateful for the generous support of the parishioners of St. Julie and St. Peter Parishes that have made this possible. I am also grateful for the volunteers who have assisted with this project who are not connected with either parish.

I was also reminded on Sunday that this is a two-year commitment. We are two months into assisting the Bryiovsky family settling in Parma. May the Lord continue to bless the work of our hands as we help get them established in our area.

Last Monday St. Julie and St. Peter Parishes began Discovering Christ, the seven week (with dinner!) that helps people come to know Jesus on a much more personal level. Though we had about 12 signed up by last Saturday morning, a total of 29 people registered or showed up the first night. According to the blurb in the bulletin, if you are still interested in Discovering Christ, you can still register with a phone call on Monday morning or simply show up this Monday evening, February 26.

Perhaps another event you may be interested in is the First Friday Forum of Lorain County. One more very important event that I want to highlight for you is the annual Evening of Penance that the Diocese of Cleveland makes available to God's Flock each year. This coming Wednesday, February 28, just about every parish in the Diocese of Cleveland will be offering three straight hours of Confession Both St. Peter and St. Julie Parish will be celebrating the Sacrament of Penance from 5:00-8:00 p.m. Confessions at St. Julie's will start a little later, after the 5:30 p.m. Mass.

This is a wonderful opportunity to make a fresh start with the Lord. If you are not comfortable with going to confession with priests you are familiar with, just go to another parish. We will all be doing the same thing at the same time, just in different places. All are more than welcome!

The Second Sunday of Lent focuses on one of the more mysterious events in the life of Jesus: the Transfiguration. The veil that separates this world and the world to come was lifted. Moses and Elijah appear. Jesus radiates light like the sun. The Father's voice is heard. The presence of the Holy Spirit in the form of a bright cloud cast a shadow on Peter, James, and John. What is this all about?

The public ministry of Jesus was at a turning point. His earthly humanity is given a taste of heavenly glory. Why? Jesus is on His way to Jerusalem where He will be rejected, suffer, and die for us, and on the third day, rise again. Remember: Jesus' transfigured glory is promised to us if we remain faithful in our trials.
