

Dear Parishioners.

Last Saturday, Fr. Isidore, Deacon Ken Deluca and I participated in the Diaconal Ordination of Deacon Del Sherman, a parishioner of St. Peter Parish. It was an amazing and uplifting liturgy. I am happy for Deacon Del and his family. Deacon Del was one of six men who were ordained to the permanent diaconate on Saturday, May 4. During the past weekend and this current weekend, each of the deacons will be visiting each other's parish to participate in a Mass of Thanksgiving with each other. Deacon Del will be giving thanks at Mass this Sunday, 8:00 a.m. at St. Peter's. A reception will follow.

Deacon Del has been assigned to serve both to St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes. I believe this is a first in our diocese. His assignment begins on May 20. We look forward to his fruitful service in the vineyard of the Lord right here in North Ridgeville! Again, congratulations Deacon Del.

Last Monday I led a couple of interesting meetings. Over lunch I oversaw my final meeting as the Priest Convener for Lorain County. I have one more Presbyteral Council meeting with the Bishop at the end of this month to conclude my three-year term.

Beginning June 1, the Diocese of Cleveland will be moving from a district model to a deanery model. The change to a deanery model will give the Bishop's priest representative (the Dean) a greater presence in the parishes in his area. It will also call for greater parish staff participation in the life of the deanery. Though the change begins on June 1, the process will be rolled out gradually. You will hear much more about this in 2025. In the meantime, I completed my term.

On Monday evening, the second joint Parish Council meeting of St. Peter and St. Julie parish councils took place at St. Julie Parish. After a period of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament we met and reviewed the past year. Council members from both parishes were grateful for our combined efforts to pray together (like the Corpus Christi procession), evangelize together (like the ChristLife programs and Reach More) and serve together (through the St. Julie-St. Peter Ukrainian Welcome Circle and Walking with Moms in Need). We also outlined some of the events of the summer (as I mentioned in last week's bulletin) and look forward to how we can continue to help each other proclaim Jesus Christ in his fullness to the people of North Ridgeville and beyond.

Finally, this is Mother's Day weekend. This is wonderful day to honor our mothers who have lovingly given so much to sustain us and train us. Whether our mothers are living or deceased we need to remember them and honor them. And though we have this day to honor mothers, in some ways our culture discourages motherhood. By nature, motherhood is demanding and inconvenient. The sentiment of many people in our time encourages mothers with inconvenient pregnancies to opt for an abortion. And though motherhood is certainly reproductive, it is not economically productive. One's value as a person is often tied to their "net-worth" instead of their God given dignity as a human being.

May we honor all mothers 365 days a year. They are worth it! In honoring them, perhaps some of the misplaced value we place on convenience and economic wellbeing, will be redirected to the superior value of mothers, children, and the God in whose image each of us are made.


Chris Sinclair

PSR Model Option Explanations

Model One: Regular Formation Sessions

Students meet regularly in classrooms with catechist on a weekly basiss for 75 minutes. Although we are not large enough and do not have enough helpers to provide everyone's first choice we are hoping to meet the majority of parishoners needs based on these survey results. Choices include the following for non-sacramental years:

- 1. SUNDAY-PSR at 9:30 AM
- SUNDAY-All PSR at 6:30 PM
- 3. SUNDAY-K-5 at 9:30 AM and 6-8 at 6:30 PM

Model Two: Family PSR Home Instruction

The Family at Home Model is a unique program that combines various events and a Home Guide to assist parents in incorporating faith into their home life and helping their children navigate the curriculum. It also offers online resources related to family life and spirituality. Every two months, families participate in events that focus on family catechesis and knowledge sharing. During half of these events, families learn about unit themes together through activities and faith discussions. The other half of the events allows children to showcase their understanding by sharing about their favorite lessons and tasks from the units. This format offers busy families the flexibility to integrate faith education into their schedules, with support, materials, and planning assistance provided during the family meetings.

Model Three: Summer Intensive PSR

The Concentrated Summer Catechesis program offers either a 1-week full-day option or a 2-week half-day option, focusing on basic catechesis for nonsacramental years. The curriculum includes a variety of activities, prayer methods, liturgical experiences, and hands-on activities to promote immersion in the faith. Participants will have the chance to integrate life and faith through activities like reflection, service, witnessing, scripture study, and multimedia lessons. The program also includes six bi-monthly meetings covering topics such as the Creed, Church Feasts and Seasons, Prayer, Liturgy, Morality, and Catholic Social Teaching with a focus on service. Parents are encouraged to consider this new and engaging religious education format for their children that covers the bulk of faith formation in the summer with six follow up meetings spaced throughout the school year.

Sacramental Preparation

St. Julie's sacramental preparation will be held during the regular school year September through May. Second Grade Sundays at 9:30 AM and Confirmation on Sundays at 6:30 PM. These times are already set. We are conducting this survey to see what needs and possibilities our parisioners are interested. There are three possible models and with enough interest all could be available next PSR year.

Dear Parishioners,

St. Julie families and PSR Students are invited to be part of a Eucharistic Procession on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ.

Come, join our pastor as he carries the sacred body of Christ down Center Ridge Road from St. Peter's to St. Julie Billiart. We will carry Jesus through North Ridgeville in a solemn procession with song.

All are welcome - moms, dads, brothers, and sisters. This year's First Communion class are invited to walk wearing their First Communion Clothes. It is about a two-mile walk, so wear comfy shoes.

Meet at St. Peter Church on Sunday, June 2, at 1:00 p.m. (right after the Noon Mass) and we will begin our journey.

If you don't want to walk the whole way from St. Peter's, park at St. Julie's and join us on Opal St. near the rectory driveway at about 1:45 - 2:00 p.m. and process through Julie Lane with us.

We will have a prayer service at St. Julie's with cookies and juice afterward.

There will be a school bus to take people back to St. Peter's.

Come and join the fellowship and praise the Lord.
