

Dear Parishioner,

Lent! Based on Jesus' 40 days in the desert, Lent is the time to deepen our relationship with God through prayer and conform our lives to Christ's way. And we have a wonderful kickoff to Lent with our two-day Parish Mission with Fr. Michael Denk. I strongly encourage you to participate in this Lenten Mission. By practicing its lessons, this mission will deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ and change your life.

Lent! I also ask you to pick one area of your life that you need to change. Ask the help of the Lord at the beginning of each day. And then turn to the Lord at the end of each day, thanking Him for your victories and asking mercy for your failures. Doing this daily, along with an occasional *Good Confession* will change your life.

Lent! Take advantage of some of the other ways we can live out Lent. Here are two helps:

- 1. **Operation Rice Bowl:** This is a way to practice almsgiving and also help your family as a whole grow in generosity for our needier brothers and sisters.
- 2. Stations of the Cross: This traditional devotion helps us understand what Jesus has done for us in his saving death. It also helps us embrace the ways that we must carry our cross in following Jesus. Stations of the Cross will be at Noon at St. Julie Billiart Parish and 7:00 p.m. at St. Peter Parish on Fridays during Lent.

This is Catholic Charities weekend. Though this seems like an interruption of our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, it is truly an expression of it. We who are fed on the Lord, are commissioned to bring Jesus, by deed and word, to others. When we support Catholic Charities, we participate in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy by the Diocese of Cleveland. In advance I thank you. May our cheerful generosity be a blessing to many people.

I met with the St. Julie Parish Council last Monday. Among other things, we discussed a short book that some of the members of the council volunteered to read. The book was *Becoming A Eucharistic People* by Timothy O'Malley. We had a lively discussion about the ways that we as a parish can deepen our devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. I will be working with them on a plan to help us grow as a parish in our celebration of the Eucharist and our devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Last Tuesday, I celebrated First Penance with our 2024 First Communion Class. We welcome these young members of our parish to the humble community of those who confess their sins and renew their relationship with Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Finally, in order to serve the people of St. Peter Parish, and after consultation with the St. Julie Parish Council and Finance Council, I am seeking to hire a Parish Coordinator. Here is a partial job description: The Parish Coordinator works with the pastor, parochial vicar, staff, various organizations, and volunteers in our church community. The role is intended to support the work of the pastor and other parish ministries.

Examples of important skills are strong communication, organizational, and understanding of the workings of a parish. Microsoft or similar applications and computer skills necessary. Ability to communicate to all parish personal and parishioners is important.

The person serving as Parish Coordinator must to be comfortable with flexible work hours and will work a maximum of 20 hours a week.

For anyone interested in applying for this role, a fuller listing of responsibilities is available on request.

As we begin this season of Lent, I strongly encourage you to come the parish mission and to prayerfully plan how you want to embrace this life changing season.

UKRAINIAN WELCOME CIRCLE Welcome Circle Update


We thank you all for your generous support of our Ukrainian family. Nadiia shared with us a few needs they have now that they have settled in and the boys are going to school.



Community Garden

Gardens are for growing, especially in our partnership with Grafton Correctional Institute. Incarcerated men are growing produce for Catholic Charities shelters and food pantries – with hearts and minds transformed.

In the garden, David finds peace and a sense of purpose. "I have the potential to do good things and so do other men here. It's about giving back to the community." Antoine is cultivating leadership skills. "Great leaders learn to follow and to serve. We do both in the garden. And a hard day's work prepares you to go back to society."

Harvest time is the highlight, yielding 1,300 pounds of vegetables in 2020 and 14,500 pounds in 2023.

Supervising fellow inmates, Richard sees men growing in compassion and empathy. "Every man in here has the desire to give back. Our work in the garden feeds thousands of people. I'm serving a long prison term but filled with gratitude. You can't begin to imagine the possibilities for transformation."

"I never imagined being homeless. I always thought I was better than that — 'til it happened to me." Todd had a job but no savings, so when a relationship ended, he stayed with his mother until she died and her home was sold.

In a crisis, Todd went to St. Elizabeth Center in Lorain, a Catholic Charities shelter for men. "They treat you with respect. You can shower, wash clothes and get good meals. It's not a place to stay for long, but I was grateful for a roof over my head."

Todd credits his Catholic Charities case worker for helping him get into permanent housing. "My self-esteem is so much better now. So many people live paycheck to paycheck, and being homeless can happen to anybody."



St. Elizabeth Center serves as a place in central Lorain for persons who are homeless, hungry or otherwise vulnerable. Services include daily hot meals, a food pantry and fresh produce, men's overnight shelter and emergency assistance.
