

## St. Julie Billiart Parish

Dear Parishioners,

One of the things that the Easter Season rings in is weddings. Though we have not had as many weddings as in the past (Lord, send us engaged couples to get married in the Church!), there is a wedding at St. Peter Parish this coming Saturday, April 27. The couple originally scheduled their wedding for 2:00 p.m. in early 2023, before St. Peter's changed its Saturday vigil Mass to 4:00 p.m. Their wedding time was not adjusted when the Mass time was changed. This puts a bit of a crimp in the St. Peter confession schedule. Since their wedding is without a Mass, the conflict will be minimal. The bottom line is this: Confessions on Saturday, April 27 at St. Peter Parish will begin at 2:45 p.m. St. Julie's Confession schedule (3:30-4:30 p.m.) remains unchanged.

I had the privilege earlier this week to conduct some Server Training classes. We currently have two servers: Dawson Davis and Ryan Papesch. I will be holding one more server training session this Monday, April 22 at 3:30 p.m. I have sent out notifications in through the St. Julie PSR Program. However, if you are not in the PSR program but are interested in becoming a server, please see me or simply show up to the training session on Monday at 3:30 p.m.

This, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is called Good Shepherd Sunday. The gospel readings are from John 10, the chapter in John's gospel where Jesus refers to himself as *the Good Shepherd*. This phrase is on the lips of our Good Shepherd two times in our reading. Jesus also highlights the way he demonstrates that he is the Good Shepherd: *He lays down his life for his sheep*. This phrase of "laying down my life" is repeated three times in our gospel reading!

These texts of scripture both comfort and challenge me. I am comforted by the amazing love of Jesus Christ, who laid down his life for us sinners! I am challenged in that, as a pastor, I am to follow in the steps of Jesus and willingly lay down my life for God's people here in North Ridgeville. Pray that I grow in becoming the Shepherd Jesus calls me to be!

This is also a time for the Church throughout the world to pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. I am very grateful for how God is answering our prayers for vocations in North Ridgeville. There are three men from the North Ridgeville parishes in our seminary system for the Diocese of Cleveland. Our seminarian who has just finished is Mr. Del Sherman. He will be ordained a permanent deacon on Saturday, May 4 at St. John Cathedral in Cleveland. He will be celebrating his ordination with gratitude at St. Peter Parish on the following weekend, May 12 at the 8:00 a.m. Mass. A reception will follow in our gym immediately after the Mass.

**St. Peter Parish also has two other seminarians. Mitch Carson** is finishing his internship year at St. Mary Seminary. His field work this year was at Our Lady of Angels Parish in Cleveland. God willing Mitch will be ordained a priest in May of 2026.

The third seminarian is a junior in the Borromeo Seminary system (about 1/3 of the classes are at Borromeo and 2/3 of the classes are at John Carrol University, the degree granting institution). His name is William Myers. Will entered Borromeo in the fall of 2023.

## 4th Sunday of Easter

Let us pray that more men (and women seeking consecrated life) will hear the voice of the Good Shepherd inviting them to follow Him in these beautiful ways of service.

Ukraine Welcome Committee Update Monthly meeting with Nadiia and Vitalii While we continue to support the household, it is extremely important that we begin to work together for them to gain important experience in managing funds and creating credit history. This is a very important step to gain independence, and over the coming months we will work with Vitalii and Nadiia to achieve that goal. Some of this will happen through a secured credit card and checking account.

All three children are doing well. Suisanna continues to "help" mom around the house and in the kitchen. The boys are doing well in school but still need some help with their reading. We have provided an assessment from a seasoned English as a Second Language (ESL) teacher and some one-on-one tutoring, but it has been spotty. We have learned that the ESL classes at Tri-C are not working well for Nadiia and Vitalii. Other Welcome Circles indicated that the lack of conversational English in the classes is a challenge. This has proven to be true for Nadiia and Vitalii as well. They have been attending classes twice a week since mid-February and they are not happy with their progress either. All are anxious to improve.

We are looking for tutoring alternatives that could be helpful to the whole family. Obviously, it is important for Vitalii's job opportunities too. There are several recommended structured programs under review. They have excellent resources for each family member. Together with Vitalii and Nadiia we will decide the best option.

Other than the reading challenges, the boys are doing well in school. We will review further with them closer to the end of the school year May 22.

As the weather is getting warmer, we are talking about fun things for the family as well. We will be looking to do some field trips with them and getting some sports equipment for the kids.

We are reviewing all aspects of these goals and are sure there will be some opportunities for folks to donate specific items or targeted donations in the next few weeks.
