

Dear Parishioners.

Today is Pentecost, the third greatest liturgical feast of the Church year, behind Easter and Christmas. John the Baptist said, "The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one who is to baptize with the Holy Spirit." (John 1:33b). A footnote in the Jerusalem Bible says this:

This phrase sums up the whole purpose of the Messiah the coming, namely, that mankind might be born again in the Spirit; the OT had already foretold it. The Spirit rests on him, and he can confer it on others, but only after his resurrection. For Jesus came in the flesh, flesh that is corruptible, and it is only when he is 'lifted up' and has gone to the Father this his body, glorified now, is fully endowed with divine, life-giving power. Thenceforward, the Spirit flows freely to the world from this body as from an inexhaustible spring.

Jesus, raised from the dead and ascended into heaven, has become the inexhaustible spring of the Holy Spirit.

This Holy Spirit is given to us in Baptism, and we are strengthened by the gifts of the Spirit in Confirmation. However, as I have often said: We have the Holy Spirit. Does the Holy Spirit have us? Someone once said that the Holy Spirit is a gentleman. In other words, the Spirit does not normally force himself on us. As creatures made in the image of God, endowed with a free will, the Spirit expects us to humbly cooperate with Him as we intentionally follow Jesus.

Perhaps the best way to respond to the grace offered to us this day is to pray. Jesus said, "How much more will the Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 11:13) This rhetorical question by Jesus highlights the fact that God really wants to give us the Holy Spirit. However, as Jesus said, we need to ask.

For what shall we ask for? Ask for those things you need to be the best version of yourself. Are you weak? Ask for strength. Are you tired? Ask for refreshment and vigor. Are you dull? Pray to be enlightened. Are you afraid or timid? Ask for courage. And then act like you have what you have asked for. God will show up.

One more thing: as the footnote from the Jerusalem Bible said, the Spirit flows freely to the world from this body as if from an inexhaustible spring. Ask Jesus to fill you afresh and hear your prayers when you receive the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus will flood you with His Spirit and equip you to be his good friend and faithful disciple.

I am grateful for Bill Johanssen for arranging our first Cycling Saints of the year last week. Our ride from Wallace Lake in Berea to North Royalton was enjoyable. It was a perfect day for a bike ride. Our next ride will be Sunday, June 22. The site has not yet been determined. I will keep you posted.

By the time you are reading this column, Fr. Isidore and I will have moved to the St. Julie Rectory. Thank you for your prayers for this transition. I know that I had to "purge" before moving. And we will need to do a bit more purging now that we are here.

This weekend we are again promoting the 2025 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal. Though the main campaign was in February, we do a mini repeat at this time of the year, especially for those who were out of town for the first appeal. Please remember: your generosity will enable you to participate in these good works of our Diocese through Catholic Charities. Thank you for your cheerful participation in this appeal.

I know that a number of parishioners at St. Julie Parish have loved ones buried at St. Peter Parish Cemetery. As part of the 150<sup>th</sup> Jubilee Year activities, David Bogner, who volunteers as the sextant of the St. Peter Cemetery, will be leading a tour of the cemetery immediately after the 4:00 p.m. Mass at St. Peter's. Nothing scary about this tour. You will learn about some of the early Catholics in the area, as well as clergy and military personnel who are buried at the St. Peter Cemetery. All are welcome.

The Procession & Adoration

Beginning at St. Peter Catholic Church the route will proceed going east on Center Ridge to Emerald, to Pearl, to Opal, to Julie Lane.

Two stops for brief prayer will be made along the route. Water will be available.

Silent Time for Prayer and Adoration, Daytime Prayer, and Benediction will take place at St. Julie Billiart at the end of the Eucharistic Procession.

Reception to follow at St. Julie Billiart.

Parking & Transportation

Parishioners may park at either parish. The Eucharistic Procession will begin at St. Peter Catholic Church immediately following the 12:00pm Mass.

Following the Eucharistic Procession a shuttle will be available at St. Julie in order to begin returning to St. Peter around 3:00pm.

A driver will be available, if a ride is needed, during the procession.
