From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

Last Sunday I was able to participate in the St. Julie Volunteer Appreciation Banquet. Complete with a Mardi Gras theme we shared a nice meal at Wagner's of Westlake, crowned the King and Queen of St. Julie's (by random raffle) and tested our skill with a set of trivia questions. I am grateful for the St. Julie Parish Council for arranging this event and I am most grateful to the people of St. Julie Parish who seek build up the parish community by their selfless service.

This is Mission Week at St. Julie Parish. Karen May will be presenting a three-evening mission entitled A Walk Through Holy Week. Born from her desire to impart understanding and enthusiasm for the Church's most sacred week to her children, Karen will be helping St. Julie and St. Peter Parishioners enter into Holy Week.

I strongly encourage you to make this mission a priority. Holy Week is not simply our "look back" at Jesus and how he lived his last week on earth before his glorious resurrection. Holy Week is an invitation to enter into these events in such a way that we are touched, healed, enlightened, and transformed by Jesus Christ, who gave his all for us.

Bring your children. The first 25 children will receive a door prize each night. I look forward to seeing you there.

A week from Wednesday, March 8, St. Julie Parish will be participating in the Diocesan Wide Evening of Penance. Just about every Church in the Diocese of Cleveland will be offering the Sacrament of Penance from 5:00-8:00 p.m. Fr. Isidore will be available for confessions that evening at St. Julie's. I strongly encourage each and every one of you to participate in this special time for our diocese. If you are not near St. Julie Parish at that time on March 8, find a parish near you and go to confession. Perhaps you would feel more comfortable celebrating this sacrament with a priest you do not know, go to a different parish. The important thing is that we humbly and contritely confess our sins and receive sacramental absolution. May the Lord grant us his saving grace!

If you are unable to make this Diocesan Wide Evening of Penance, there are other opportunities. The Joint Parish Penance Service with St. Peter Parish will be held at St. Julie Parish this Lent on Sunday, March 19 at 7:30 p.m. Also, Confessions are heard each Saturday from 3:30-4:30 p.m. Pope Francis says, "Go! Do not wait another day. Go, the priest will be good. And Jesus (will be) there, and Jesus is better than the priest—Jesus receives you. He will receive you with so much love! Be courageous and go to Confession."

This First Sunday of Lent highlights the temptations of Jesus. It is helpful to know that Jesus was tempted. And the fact that He did not sin means that he can help us in our temptations.

This event in the life of Jesus is placed at the beginning of Lent to remind us that Lent, and in some way, all of life is a test. And the test is not for God to discover whether or not we will pass. The test is for us to discover ourselves. We may find ourselves more disordered and weaker than we previously thought. Without yielding to discouragement, we repent, seek God's grace and begin again. Perhaps we will discover in ourselves greater resolve and patience than we realized. We turn to the Lord and give thanks for God's work in us. In every way, we seek to give alms, pray and fast (make sacrifices) this Lent that we might truly be a people of faith, hope, and love, bringing Christ to the world.



A Lenten Invitation...

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, when we enter the 40 days of preparation for Easter. This is a season of repentance, and we are called to fast, to pray and to give alms. The activities, events, and prayer opportunities available at **St. Julie Billiart (SJB)** and **St. Peter (SP)** Catholic Churches, as indicated, are meant to be suggestions to assist in living out the Lenten Season. May this Lent be one of spiritual conversion for each one of us.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Lent begins with us hearing the words, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." Ashes will be distributed February 22nd during Masses at:

SP: 8:15 a.m. [LVE] and 7:00 p.m. [LVE] 9:00 a.m. [LVE] and 7:00 p.m. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (only one meal) and abstinence (refrain from meat).

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

During Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through fasting, abstinence and prayer.

- We fast on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, and the day Christ died for us, Good Friday. Fasting is for those age 18 to 59, unless you are pregnant or have an illness that could cause harm, e.g., diabetes. When we fast, only one full meal should be eaten that day. Two smaller meals could be eaten but they should not exceed one full meal.
- When we abstain from meat, we are voluntarily giving up something good, for our spiritual benefit. The practice of Abstinence is for everyone over the age of 14 on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent.



STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Come and meditate on the final steps of Jesus as he journeyed to Calvary through the Stations of the Cross. We pray the **Stations every Friday in Lent at SP: 7:00 p.m.** | **SJB: 7:00 p.m.**

CONFESSIONS

Lent is a time of repentance, a time to give up sin and return to God, our loving Father. While recognizing and saying our sins to a priest may seem painful, it is a good pain that restores the soul. Confessions during Lent are:

• Every Saturday from 3:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. in the Church (SP & SJB)

• Communal Penance Service - March 19th - 7:30 p.m. in the Church at St. Julie's

Week 1 Update

The Spring 2023 40 Days for Life Campaign began this past Wednesday. God has worked many amazing miracles during each 40 Days for Life Campaign! Please pray every day for more miracles, and for an end to all abortion. Watch the bulletin for opportunities to gather with fellow parishioners in prayer. As we begin the Spring Campaign, these words from the U.S. Bishops Respect Life Program remind us of what's at stake and what we can be doing:

Another Look at Abortion

Uniquely You

From your first moments of existence, you had all the DNA that would determine your sex, facial features, physique, and the color of your skin, hair, and eyes. At 24 days, your heart began beating. By 8 weeks, all your organs were present, and your unique fingerprints were forming. Ultrasounds show that by 18 weeks, you could swim, somersault, suck your thumb, and even cover your ears if you heard loud music. If you'd been born just 25 weeks after conception, your chance of survival would be over 90 percent, and that's still months before full-term birth.

If someone takes an innocent person's life after he or she is born, it's against the law; before birth, it's legal in many states and called abortion. The only real difference is a declaration by the U.S. Supreme Court in Roe v. Wade (1973).

Abortion and the Law

The Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization (June 2022) ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand that was ushered in by Roe v. Wade in 1973. This regime was based on the indefensible view that the U.S. Constitution forbids government from protecting the preborn child in the womb from the violence of abortion. The Supreme Court in Dobbs concluded that there is nothing in the Constitution's text, history, American legal tradition, or the Court's precedents that justified the extreme holding of Roe. In Dobbs, the Supreme Court returned the issue of abortion to the people's elected representatives at the Federal and State levels. It will take time for the Dobbs decision to play out and there is great variation in how states treat abortion. In the meantime, abortion is legal in more states than not, and more work is needed in the coming months and years.

Effects of Abortion

Abortion results in the death of a child. For many mothers, abortion causes severe and long-lasting emotional, psychological, and spiritual trauma. Family relationships may suffer as the aborted child's father, grandparents, or other family members experience their own guilt, grief, or loss. Even if the mother keeps her abortion secret, family members can be distressed by changes in the mother's behavior and mental or emotional health.

What the Church Teaches

The Church has consistently taught that every human life is precious and worthy of protection. Every intentional abortion is gravely wrong. In April 2018, Pope Francis wrote: "Our defence of the innocent unborn ... needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development."

What Are We to Do?

Love them both! Support women who need help during and after difficult pregnancies through local pregnancy care centers such as Birthright (<u>birthright.org</u>) or Cornerstone (<u>cornerstonepregnancy.org</u>).

Educate yourself and others about the struggles some experience after abortion and refer those seeking help to: hopeafterabortion.org.

Most importantly, pray daily for the end to abortion, that all mothers and children would experience the loving support of the Church community, and that all who suffer after abortion would find healing and peace.


