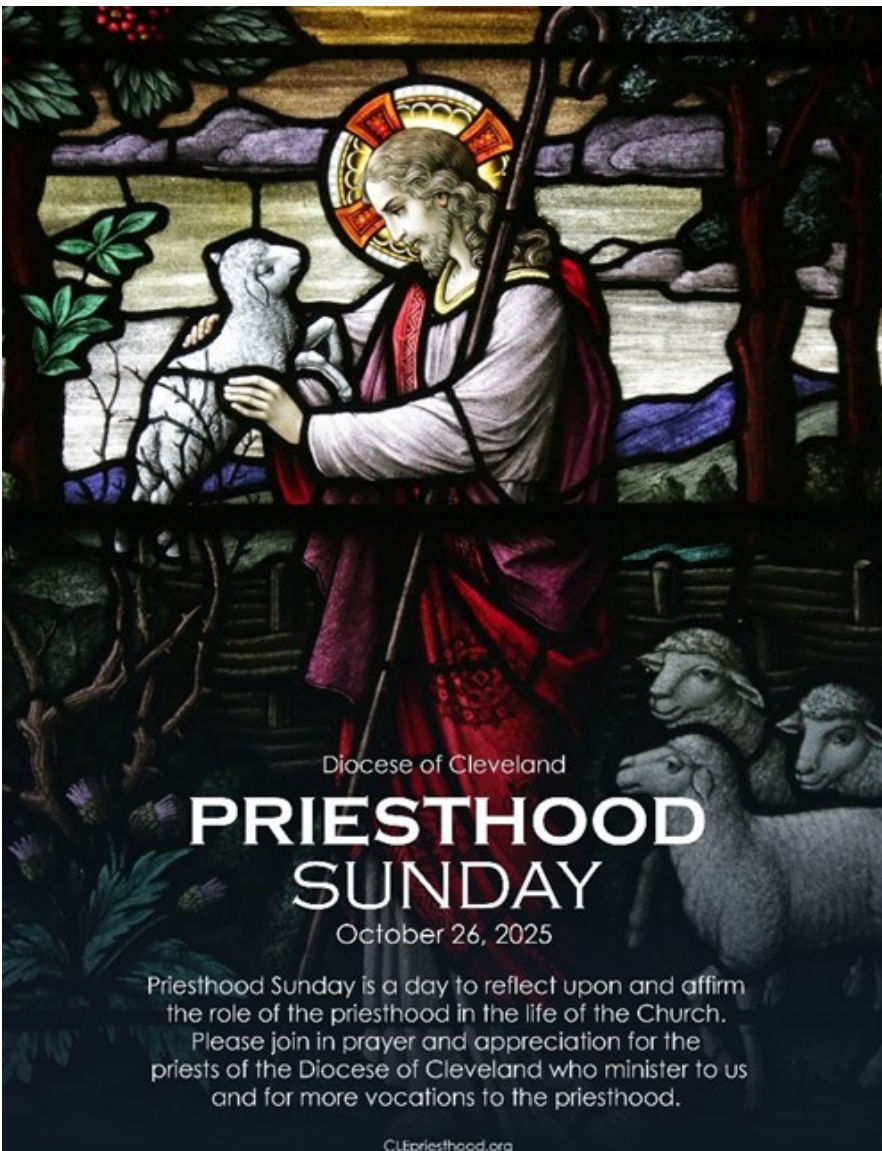

Dear Parishioners,

The *Walking with Moms in Need* initiative hosted its second annual "Tea" Luncheon on Saturday, October 18. This beautiful event not only raised funds that equip WWMIN to serve the women they encounter, but it also raised awareness of the needs that are out there. These "moms in need" have a variety of needs. They need material assistance. They need the social support of a friend. They need to know that God cares and that they are worthwhile.

My hope is that this luncheon will inspire other women to join our WWMIN team. It is a great *pro-life* ministry. Yes, we seek to end abortion and defend the inherent value of the unborn. St. Peter and St. Julie parishes host a fancy luncheon on occasion. However, St. Peter and St. Julie parishes host breakfast just about every month for women and men. The Women's Breakfasts are on the Second Saturday of the month. The Men's Breakfasts are on the third Saturdays of the month. Besides a wonderful breakfast, both the women's and men's gatherings have some spiritual input (live or a video) and upbuilding discussion. If you have never participated in these breakfasts, I invite you to do so in November. Good food, spiritual input, and holy conversation: what's not to like! **More information is on pages five and six in the bulletin.**

This coming Saturday is All Saints Day. This Holy Day is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year because it falls on a Saturday. However, because it is a Solemn Holy Day both St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes will be having Mass on Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. **Even though you are not obliged to come to All Saints Day Mass this year, I encourage you to participate in Mass. Celebrate the eternal family we hope to join at the end of our lives.**

Sunday, November 2, is All Souls Day. This day of special prayer for our deceased loved ones addresses both the nature of God and the nature of humanity. God is holy, Holy, HOLY! Sacred Scripture teaches us that "without holiness no one will see the Lord." (Hebrews 12:15b) People are sinners. St. Paul rightly told the Church of Rome, *All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.* (Romans 3:23)

Thank God for Jesus Christ! He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. (John 1:35) He is the one who makes us holy and ready for the brightness of God. However, in spite of the graces at work in us during our earthly journey, we may not be "ready" for heaven yet. This is why we have "purgatory." This is that place where souls destined for heaven are freed from disordered attachments that they may be fully attached to God. And this is what **All Souls Day** is about. **We pray for the souls in purgatory**, especially our deceased loved ones, that, freed from sin and disordered attachments, they will be so transformed as to live in the presence of the all-holy God for all eternity.

I am writing this letter before leaving for Rome. If possible, I will send back a picture or two before this bulletin is published. I also hope to send a short travel log of our Italian pilgrimage for the next bulletin. Until then, know that you and your prayer intentions are with us as we visit some of the churches and shrines in Italy. *Caio!*

October 25/26

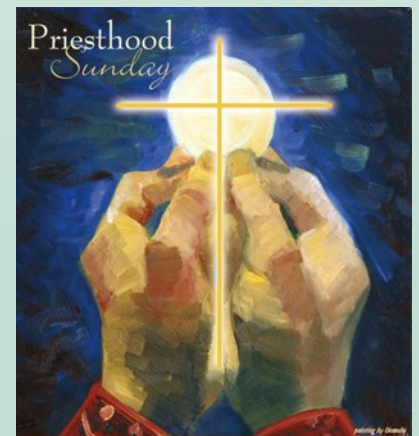

## Week 5 Update

**Entering the final week of the Fall Campaign, there's exciting news to share. Two babies were saved from abortion, in Cleveland, and on the same day! Praise God!! Keep praying -- God is hearing and answering our prayers!**

**Mary was praying at the Preterm abortion facility in Cleveland last Friday afternoon and filed this report:**

*"A young woman was pulling out of Preterm in the early afternoon. She opened her window to receive the Help is Available literature in my hand (the Help is Available brochure lists organizations that will help an expectant mom with everything she needs before and after her baby is born...) She responded with, "I couldn't do it." I immediately handed her and explained the free ultrasound coupon to be used at the ICU Mobile Ultrasound unit in Cleveland. I gave her my phone number and encouraged her to call me to see what else we can do to help her. She responded again, "I just can't go through with this." I told her I never met a young woman who was sorry that she made the decision to give life to her baby. I encouraged her once again to please call me. I am praying that she will."*

**Fred was praying at Preterm later that same afternoon:**

*"There were pro-lifers on either side of the car as it stopped on the exit apron leaving Preterm. The pro-lifers on the driver's side of the car talked to the male driver. I approached on the passenger side of the stopped car with a female sitting inside. The driver motioned to the mom to roll down the window to speak with me. I offered the pro-life information in my hand and asked, "Did you change your mind?" The couple both nodded yes! I said, "God bless you both. I am happy to hear that." I handed her the prolife information and they drove away."*

**What a blessing to see how God is hearing and answering the prayers of His people!** Please pray for these moms and dads, and all the moms and dads who choose life. Often the circumstances that brought them to the abortion facility are waiting for them when they return home. This is why prayers are so critical, and also why the amazing services provided by the pregnancy help centers are so important (for a list of local pregnancy help service centers, see [stjuliebilliart.org/moms-in-need](http://stjuliebilliart.org/moms-in-need).)

**This Thursday, you can join with fellow St. Julie Billiart parishioners to pray at the Planned Parenthood abortion mill in Bedford Heights from 12noon to 1pm.** Our prayers, at the very place where babies are being killed, provide God an opportunity to work in and through us for the benefit of all who enter. Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am.

**If you can't make it to Planned Parenthood, you can pray with fellow parishioners in the church, also on Thursday from 12noon to 1pm.**

**Another opportunity for prayer is to join with the St. Julie Billiart Rosary Group to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm in the church, followed by Eucharistic Adoration from 2-5pm.**

**This Monday, St. Peter Church participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm at the Preterm abortion facility and simultaneously at St. Peter Church.** Those going to Preterm leave at 11:10 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot and return at 1:45 PM. Those praying at St Peter Church meet there at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.

## Our Sign of Hope



There is perhaps no more beautiful celebration than when parents bring their newborn child to the waters of baptism. Parents, godparents, family, and friends share in this sacrament with incomparable joy. For in baptism, we share in Christ's death and resurrection, and through the outward signs of water and oil, are made *children of God* and given the hope of eternal life with Him.

"The death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith and the basis of our hope."<sup>1</sup> Through our Lord Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven, death is overcome, and life is victorious. "Hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite not knowing what the future may bring."<sup>2</sup> Because of this Christian hope, we can face the unknown trials of life with faith rather than fear.

We are called to be signs of hope to all people, especially those whose goodness, value, and dignity are undermined. As members of the Body of Christ, we carry this hope with us as we continue Jesus' mission on earth. Pope Leo XIV encourages us, "How important it is that each and every baptized person feel himself or herself called by God to be a sign of hope in the world today."<sup>3</sup>

Sadly, there is a devastating absence of hope today. We see this most profoundly in a sweeping disregard for human life in its most vulnerable forms and stages. Abortion and assisted suicide are products of

hopelessness and despair. Yet even amid the increasing attacks on human life, we know that the "storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death."<sup>4</sup>

We have been entrusted with a message of hope for the woman who finds herself unexpectedly pregnant or for the man diagnosed with a terminal illness. At these challenging moments, we must bring God's presence, witnessing to His love, and inspiring a renewal of hope in those whose hearts are burdened. For "hope is born of love and based on the love springing from the pierced heart of Jesus upon the cross."<sup>5</sup>

Having been "buried with Christ in Baptism, we receive in his resurrection the gift of a new life that breaks down the walls of death."<sup>6</sup> Confident of God's presence within us, may we share the Gospel of Life with those most in need of hope, knowing that "the grace of God precedes and accompanies his people as they press forward firm in faith, active in charity and steadfast in hope."<sup>7</sup>
