

# 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Dear Parishioners,

November is a month of remembering. We remembered our deceased loved ones in a particular way on November 2 and continue to pray for them throughout this month. It is also a month for us to remember our blessings and thank God, especially as we approach Thanksgiving.

I want to take a moment here to offer thanks to the Taste and See retreat planning team: Jessica Angelo, Beth Kawalec, Cheryle Koberna, Karen Hrusch, and Karla Sisinni. Their efforts resulted in an inspiring and uplifting mini retreat that truly gave one the flavor of the historic National Eucharistic Congress that took place in Indianapolis this summer. It was a blessing to parishioners at St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes, as well as parishioners from a number of other parishes. Again, thanks Taste and See team.

As we draw to the close of the Liturgical Year, our readings talk of the end of the world. The words of Jesus in today's gospel from Mark 13 are quite dramatic:

In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory.

#### Is that day near at hand?

This question has been raised by almost every generation since the earthly life of Jesus. St. John, in his first letter said, It is the last hour. (1 John 2:18) By this he meant that God's plan is accomplished in Jesus Christ. The climax of his death, resurrection, ascension, and outpouring of the Holy Spirit will be his return. That is the only definitive step that remains.

So how now shall we live? I believe the response to that question depends on how we are living now. A saint was playing cards (St. John Bosco?) with his brother priests during a recreation time, and a somewhat self-righteous member of the community confronted him and asked, *What would you do if you knew you would die tonight?* The future saint said, *Keep playing this hand, because it's a good one!* In other words, he was ready to meet the Lord. May we all live this way!

On the other hand, (no pun intended) a friend of mine told me of a time when he had strayed from Christ and his ways. He had a dream one night that dealt with two very rebellious young women who had willfully broken just about all the commandments and gleefully lived in spiritual darkness. In his dream they were killed in a sudden accident and found themselves in hell. When they saw Satan they said, "We served you while on earth. What's our reward?" He laughed at them. They then found themselves stuck to a wall and the devil mocked them. When my friend woke up shaken to the core. He immediately sought out a priest, confessed his sins and began to follow Christ with devotion. Continued... Jesus has told us that we do not know the day or the hour of his return. This also includes the day of our return to him. So how shall we live? Again, it is not so much about how, but about who. We ought to live for Him! If we are doing so, let us not stray from Christ and his manner of life. If we are not doing so, let us get back on track. Confession is a good place to start. Jesus came that we might "have life and have it more abundantly." (John 10:10) By prayer, holy reading, loving, and generous service, as well as Christian friendships we will stay on track and share in Christ's abundant life now and forever.


