


PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Earlier this week I was able to participate at the "Ballpark Mass" with Bishop Malesic and over a 1000 Catholics at Canal Park in Akron. After an inspiring Mass we had a half-mile procession with the Blessed Sacrament through the streets of Akron to St. Bernard Church. During the Mass Bishop Malesic blessed the delegates of the Diocese of Cleveland who will be participating in the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in mid-July. I am grateful for the blessing and am looking forward to the gathering in Indianapolis, an event that we pray will rekindle the faith of many Catholics.

I was also privileged to visit our neighboring parish, St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception in Avon as they hosted the National Pilgrim Our Lady of Fatima Virgin Statue that travels around the United States. I was encouraged by the many people who were participating in the devotional practices that had been arranged that day at St. Mary's, as well as the confessions that I heard. May our Lady, the Immaculate Conception, intercede for our country, especially during this election year.

Our readings this weekend encourage our faith in Jesus Christ, who intervenes in the needs of people. The scriptures record some of the more outstanding of Jesus works, like this woman who suffered for 12 years at the hands of physicians who could not really heal her. She touched the hem of Jesus' garment and was healed. Or like the daughter of the synagogue official Jairus, whom Jesus raised from the dead.

St. John wrote at the end of his gospel, there are also many other things that Jesus did, but if these were to be described individually, I do not think the whole world would contain the books that would be written. (John 21:25) I think of the millions of people that Jesus touched, perhaps less dramatically, but life-changing none the less. As we welcome Jesus in the Eucharist, let us confidently bring him our needs, knowing that power inexhaustibly flows from Him.


Men's Breakfast


