

# Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is the time to think about inviting your family and friends to consider full membership in the Catholic Faith. The RCIA will once again convene in late summer or early fall. This is an opportunity for those who have never been: baptized, those baptized outside the Catholic Church, or those baptized Catholic who have never received the sacrament of Holy Eucharist; to be baptized, profess their belief in the Catholic faith or to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are an adult who has never been Confirmed, there is a separate process to complete your initiation. Call Fr. George, 327-1978.

#### Family Perspective

Today's second reading, from Ephesians, makes today "nudge Sunday." Husbands nudge their wives when they hear "wives should be subordinate to their husbands." Wives return the nudge at the words "husbands love your wives as Christ loves the Church." The key to this reading is all in the first line: "be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ." When love is mutual, freely, and generously shared between husband and wife, marriage goes to a whole new, wonderful level!



Dear God, give me the faith to trust Jesus always. Amen.




