


#### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

This is an opportunity for those who have never been: baptized, those baptized outside the Catholic Church, or those baptized Catholic who have never received the sacrament of Holy Eucharist; to be baptized, profess their belief in the Catholic faith or to complete the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. 


#### Cleveland Retrouvaille Weekend





Dear Jesus, thank you for giving up so much, so that I could grow close to God.




