Dear Parishioners,

The word "Jubilee" comes from a Hebrew word meaning "ram's horn". According to Leviticus 25, the ram's horn would be blown at the beginning of every 50th year, inaugurating the Jubilee Year. It would be a year of cancelling debts, returning to one's paternal heritage (plot of land) and freeing captives.

The Catholic Church has celebrated Jubilee Years for the whole Church starting in 1300 AD. These years have been spaced at 50 and, more recently, 25-year increments. Thus, 2025 is a Jubilee Year for the Catholic Church throughout the world with the theme chosen by Pope Francis, *Pilgrims of Hope*. I will be publishing ways to celebrate this Holy Year as it draws nearer.

One of the newer ministries shared between St. Peter and St. Julie parishes is called Walking with Moms in Need. The name of the ministry describes its purpose. It assists women with crisis pregnancies, as well as mothers with infants. They do this by befriending these women and getting them the resources they need. A fundraiser that is guaranteed to be "fun" will take place on Saturday, October 26, at St. Peter Gym. Details are in this bulletin, and all are welcome.

Last Friday, Fr. Al Laubenthal, a retired priest of our diocese and an occasional helper with weekday and weekend Masses, celebrated his 90th birthday by taking the 8:15 a.m. Mass at St. Peter Parish. Fr. Al was baptized at St. Mary's in Avon and grew up here in North Ridgeville. Fr. Al has been given an amazing constitution (still spry in body and mind) that he keeps in shape for the service of God's people. Thank you, Fr. Al, for your service to our diocese and occasionally to the people of God at St. Julie Parish. And, Happy 90th Birthday!

Today's readings highlight that being a disciple of Jesus is counter cultural. With the advent of social media, many people use this platform to bash people and toot their own horn. In today's gospel, Jesus asked his disciples what they were talking about. They were silent, because they did not want to admit that they were talking about which of them was the greatest. Jesus knew that and then showed them the path to greatness. Embracing a child, Jesus said, Whoever receives a child such as this in my name, receives me.

We welcome Jesus into our lives, not by rubbing elbows with the rich and famous, but by lovingly welcoming the powerless and insignificant. St. James warns us: Where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. (James 3:16) When we are always looking at what others have (things or favored roles) and seek those things because we think they will make us happy, there is disorder in our lives.


