

St. Julie Billiart Parish

Dear Parishioners,

Ash Wednesday is less than two weeks away. How ought we prepare? It was in April of 1975 (fifty years ago!) I surrendered my life to Jesus Christ. Around this time a bible study leader at Ohio State encouraged me to start memorizing Sacred Scripture through a program called the Topical Memory System. Short passages of scripture were printed on card stock about the size of a business card. The very first card read: Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, this person is a new creation; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come (2 Corinthians 5:17 NASB). This short passage highlights that, in Christ, I am made new. I will have different values, different approaches to problems and ultimately a different destiny.

Even 50 years later this passage speaks to me, especially in the light of Lent. So often we think about what we want to do during this special liturgical season. Perhaps we would do better to think about who we want to become. In Christ, we are a new creation, and the old things have passed away. Are we hanging onto some dead, old things that are dragging us back into the world? In Christ, behold, new things have come. Is there some new thing that we currently lack that will make us more like a new creation in Christ?

During this upcoming season of Lent, we want to let go of the old things that have led us away from God. We want to embrace the virtues that will help us reflect the newness of Christ to our circle of influence. As we reflect on who we want to become, we can invite Christ's grace to dwell in those "weak virtues" and make them strong. Most likely the Lord will give us opportunities to exercise those virtues too! Our goal is to reflect Christ to the world, to be His new creations.

Our readings today cover one of the most challenging aspects of following Jesus: loving our enemies. This is especially difficult in an age of social media where it seems that civil discourse is often put on the shelf.

Shortly after my conversion (yes...50 years ago...and so much work to be done in my life!) I heard a Catholic layman reflect on our first reading from 1 Samuel 26. David was being pursued by King Saul, who sought to put him to death out of envy. David had the perfect opportunity to kill King Saul when he came upon the King asleep amid his sleeping soldiers. One spear thrust and his enemy would be eliminated!

David refrained from harming the Lord's anointed King Saul. Why? Saul was not a "private person" but a sacred office bearer. He was the legitimate King. Killing Saul would be a challenge to God's authority and invite civil war among the Israelites. It would also set a precedent: if you don't like the king, get rid of him! Soon enough, by God's plan, David would be holding that office. As it was, David's line endured for 400 plus years, longer than any other Near East dynasty.

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are times we are frustrated with legitimate leadership in the political arena and in the Church. Using proper channels to complain is good. Verbal wars are not. Sometimes the anger we stir up causes more harm than the harms we seek to rectify. Respecting the office and knowing that we are all accountable to God will bring better results. We will also reflect the way of Christ, who prayed, Father, forgive them. They know not what they do.

Our Ukrainian Welcome Circle and the Bryiovskyis need your help!

There have been a number of Executive Orders in the last week or so addressing Immigration. UWC Members have been in these Zoom meetings as legal representatives of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) have provided insights into the impact of the Executive Orders. They also provided guidance regarding what information to share with our families. They also have provided recommendations about how to share. We have met with the Bryiovskyis and reviewed in detail everything we have so far. What they had heard made them fearful and the meeting helped to lessen some of that fear. We will continue to follow all updates and proceed as recommended. This is the short summary.

Even though the Bryiovskyis came to the US legally under Humanitarian Parole, some of the proposed changes to Immigration could put their legal status in jeopardy. Our family is currently working with an immigration lawyer to find options as are many of the other families who came to northeast Ohio sponsored by other parishes.




