

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners

It was a week ago Wednesday (a day after bulletin cut off time for last week's bulletin) the Parish Councils of St. Peter and St. Julie Parish met at St. Peter Parish for a joint meeting. It was a fruitful and hope-filled gathering. I was able to share the joys and challenges of being pastor of two parishes. I commented on the many ways that our parishes have been cooperating in doing God's work and the new ways we are doing this in 2023-2024.

I also commented on some of the challenges of pastoring two parishes. In pastoring two parishes, Bishop Malesic asked me to work smarter but not necessarily harder. I am still learning that art. And by God's grace, I'll get better at it. In the meantime I am grateful for the support staff of both parishes. Amy Gaffney, Pat Hoffman (the bookkeeper and secretary of St. Julie Parish), Suzanne Snyder, Kelly Reed, Greg Dubecky, and others have been a great help in me taking over the reins here. And the staff of St. Peter Parish, Chris Stefanek, Sandy Pawlak, Regina Wojciechowski. Cheryle Koberna and others have made the load lighter at St. Peter's.

During the meeting we had a fruitful discussion of what people want to see. Both parishes feel the need to engage younger generations. We recognize that our young adults, high school teens and elementary students (because their parents are the young adults not around church environment) are missing from Mass and other church activities. I pray that by God's grace and our labors, we can connect with these younger generations.

We started three adult education programs in this last week. During this year of parish level Eucharistic Revival, around 35 adults have gathered for a book study of Bishop Robert Barron's book This is My Body. I pray that the knowledge gained, and the material discussed deepen our understanding and devotion to Christ in the Eucharist. This program is being held at St. Peter Parish. The next book study for this Year of Eucharistic Revival will be at St. Julie Parish. The second program that we began was Discovering Christ. This was the first time we hosted the program at St. Julie Parish. There was a group of 35 people made up of parishioners from both parishes, as well as others who were simply curious. The third program we commenced this week was our Reach More discipleship training program. Again, both St. Julie and St. Peter parishes were represented in this more intensive training process.

This is Catechetical Sunday. Fr. Isidore will be here to bless Kelly Reed and the St. Julie PSR teachers. We pray that our young people come to understand and embrace the Catholic faith, heeding the voice of Christ above all other voices.

Finally, our gospel reading is a story that illustrates one of the petitions of the Our Father: forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Jesus' story shows us what it means to ask God to forgive us the way we forgive those who offend us. We cannot withhold forgiveness from others if we want to be forgiven by God. This is challenging. Perhaps these three things can help. First, when St. Paul speaks of forgiveness, he told the Ephesians to forgive,

as the Lord has forgiven you. Like the man in the story, we can experience God's forgiveness first. We need to be then quick to forgive those who have offended us. Secondly, we need to remember that forgiveness begins with a decision. We choose to forgive before we have feelings of compassion. Finally, we need to remember that forgiving those who have offended us does not always mean that the relationship will be reestablished. The offending party must acknowledge their offensive behavior and ask for forgiveness.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ISSUE 1



What is Issue 1?

Issue 1 is a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would endanger the health and safety of women, threaten parental rights, and allow for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Ohioans will vote on November 7, 2023, whether to make this change to the Ohio Constitution.

What would Issue 1 do?

Put women at risk:

 Health and safety standards in Ohio could be eliminated. Doctors could no longer need to examine a woman or explain the risks of the abortion procedure ahead of time.

Threaten parental rights:

 A fifteen-year-old could have an abortion without her parents knowing. Current Ohio law requires parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion. These parental right protections could be removed as they directly conflict with the amendment which would allow all individuals, including minors, to make their own reproductive decisions.

Allow for abortions of fully formed babies:

 Abortion would be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy. Physicians at an abortion clinic could use a woman's age or emotional well-being as a reason to perform an abortion in the 3rd trimester.

Would abortion be illegal in Ohio if Issue 1 does not pass?

If Issue 1 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Ohio until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. This standard was challenged in court and placed on hold, allowing for abortions up to 22 weeks as of September 15, 2023. Current laws that protect the safety of women and parental rights would stay in effect.

Doesn't Issue 1 simply restore Ohio back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Issue I goes dangerously beyond what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It opens the door to remove important health and safety measures that protect women, threatens parental consent and notification of any minor seeking an abortion, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Issue 1 fails?

The passing or failure of Issue 1 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives when her life is in danger, even if the treatment results in the loss of life of her unborn child. There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage. In the case of an ectopic pregnancy, the life-affirming option is to surgically remove the mother's fallopian tube in which the embryo has implanted. No law restricts this care in Ohio or any other state in the country.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faith-based and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born. Project Rachel helps those struggling post-abortion. Every woman should be able to depend upon a community for support and the Catholic Church remains committed to woman in need.


