

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate Priesthood Sunday, a day to express gratitude for the priests that serve the Church as well as pray for vocations. I invite you to join Fr. Isidore and me as we express thanks to God for our vocations to the priesthood. We are grateful to the Lord for associating us with Himself through Holy Orders that we might serve the People of God! It is a privilege to proclaim the gospel, celebrate the Sacraments and serve God's flock. We pray that God keep us faithful to our ministry until that day He calls us home.

Jesus said. The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest (Matthew 9:37-38) The Lord desires our salvation and has willed to use other people, in particular those in ordained ministry, to bring in the harvest.

I went to major seminary (graduate school) at St. Mary Seminary on Ansel Rd., just east of Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. St. Mary Seminary has since moved to the campus of Borromeo Seminary in Wickliffe. With the Diaconate Formation Program, the Lay Ecclesial Ministry Program, the Office for Continuing Education of Priests and Ministers, they form the Center for Pastoral Leadership (most often referred to as The CPL.

Over the door of the old St. Mary Seminary was this Latin phrase: Spes Messis in Semine, which translates, The hope of harvest is in the seed. Those in seminary formation are the seed. By their formation and the Sacrament of Holy Orders, they are prepared to be fruitful laborers in God's field. It is our hope that well-formed candidates for Holy Orders will bring a good harvest for the Lord.

We are grateful for the formation the CPL provides. Our two deacons, Rev. Mr. Ken DeLuca and Rev. Mr. John Rivera, were both prepared for the Diaconate through the Diaconal Formation program.

Let us pray, Lord, give us more harvesters.

HERE ARE A COUPLE OF REMINDERS: November 1, All Saints day is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses at St. Julie's are at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on November 1. There will be a Mass on All Souls Day, Thursday, November 2nd (though not a Holy Day of Obligation) at 9:00 a.m. All are welcome.

MASS OF INSTALLATION: Bishop Malesic will be here next Sunday, November 5, for the 11:00 a.m. Mass. He will be installing me as the third pastor of St. Julie Billiart Parish. Our choirs are regathering under the leadership of Bill Boomer and Danny O'Brien (he is returning simply to assist with this one Mass) to lead us in music. Refreshments will follow. All of you are most welcome. (continued)

Finally, in our gospel reading, Jesus gives us the Great Commandments: Love God with your whole life and Love your neighbor as ourselves. This is easy to remember. However, it is somewhat challenging to practice. We can make excuses for not spending time with God. We can find it difficult to love our neighbor. St. John reminds us, If anyone says, "I love God," but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. This is the commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother. (I John 4:20-21)

O Lord, grant us the grace to die to ourselves and so as to love both our neighbor and you!



Misleading Facts About Issue 1

The Catholic Church supports and defends women, children, and vulnerable Ohioans through accompaniment, social services, and material assistance. Week 5 Update

We are now in Week 5 of the 40 Days for Life Fall Campaign, and there's exciting news to share: We know of 142 babies whose lives have been saved from abortion! Praise God!! This also means that 142 moms and dads were spared the pain and suffering of participating in the death of their own child. Your prayers are making a difference! Keep praying!

Around the U.S. and around the world, children are being saved from death by abortion because people are praying. Here is one account of a child saved in Kalamazoo, Michigan:

Last year, Michigan voters amended the state constitution to include a right to abortion. It was a devastating blow to abortion-vulnerable moms and babies (Ohio faces a similar amendment in November's election). But 40 Days for Life participants in Michigan aren't whining. They're winning with their prayers and with their presence. Mary normally sidewalk counsels -- praying on the sidewalk in front of the abortion facility -- on Thursday mornings but decided to go out on a Tuesday morning "because of the 40 Days for Life campaign," wrote Joe, the local leader. While she was on the sidewalk, Mary told a couple worried about the cost of raising a child about the free resources available to help them get through their pregnancy...and beyond! "After talking for some time, they told Mary that they were not going to have the abortion, and then they headed over to the Alternatives Pregnancy Resource Center across the street," Joe said. "Praise God!" Joe said that 73 people have signed up to pray at the Kalamazoo vigil this fall--and reminded those on his team who haven't that it's not too late to do so.

What a blessing to see how God is hearing and answering the prayers of His people! Please pray for this mom and dad, and all the moms and dads who choose life. Often the circumstances that brought them to the abortion facility are waiting for them when they return home. This is why prayers are so critical, and also why the amazing services provided by the pregnancy help centers are so important (for a list of local pregnancy help service centers, see stylliebilliart.org/moms-in-need.)

This Thursday, you can join with fellow St. Julie Billiart parishioners to pray at the Planned Parenthood abortion mill in Bedford Heights from 12noon to 1pm. Our prayers, at the very place where babies are being killed, provide God an opportunity to work in and through us for the benefit of all who enter. Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am.

If you can't make it to Planned Parenthood, you can pray with fellow parishioners in the church, also on Thursday from 12noon to 1pm.

Another opportunity for prayer is to join with the St. Julie Billiart Rosary Group to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm in the church.

Each Monday, St. Peter Church participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm at the Preterm abortion facility and simultaneously at St. Peter Church. Those going to Preterm leave at 11:10 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot and return at 1:45 PM. Those praying at St Peter Church meet there at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.

God is working many miracles in response to the prayers of His people. Keep praying!
