Dear Parishioners.

The word tradition means "to hand over." This word is key to understanding the Church and life itself. Tradition is the way we make transitions. It is how we hand on our way of life. It is how the Church passes on the truth of Jesus Christ from one generation to the next.

The scriptures today highlight the role of St. Peter. From the final chapter of the gospel of John, the risen Lord Jesus had prepared a breakfast for his followers on the shores of Sea of Tiberius (also known as Galilee). During this breakfast, Jesus re-commissions Simon Peter to lead the early Church. Three times Peter denied Jesus. Three times Peter pledges his love for Jesus. Three times Jesus commands Peter to feed and tend His flock.

Our first reading from Acts 5 gives us a sense of Peter's leadership. It was Peter who first proclaimed the gospel on Pentecost (Acts 2). With John, Peter was the first to be jailed for proclaiming Christ (Acts 4). In Acts 5, all of the Apostles were jailed. After being taken into custody a second time (they were miraculously released the first time), Peter (singled out) and the apostles replied, "We must obey God rather than men."

This marks quite a transition. Religious authority did not reside with the Sanhedrin. It was with Peter and the apostles. Later in the Acts of the Apostles, Peter would be the first to proclaim the gospel to the Gentiles (Acts 10) and steer the community's deliberative process (Acts 15) to the Church's approach to incorporating the Gentiles into the fold.

Throughout the centuries, the role of Peter has been a key to handing on the faith from generation to generation. With the death of Pope Francis on Easter Monday, the tradition of choosing a new Pope begins again on Wednesday, May 7. Voting Cardinals will be locked into (conclave-with key) the Sistine Chapel and to a new Pope. And though none of us will be casting votes, our part in the process is important: we are to pray! We ask that the Holy Spirit give us the Pope the Church needs at this time.

Last week, we practiced some of our local spring sacramental traditions. On Tuesday, April 29, Bishop Malesic came to St. Peter Parish to confirm 53 young adults and adults from St. Julie and St. Peter Parish. I am grateful for Jill Papesch, of St. Julie's Parish, who oversees our Confirmation program, as well as Andrea Byrne, the St. Peter day school Eighth Grade teacher, who oversaw Confirmation preparation for our day school students and Sr. Sean Groh SND, who worked with our adult confirmandii. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit so inflame our newly Confirmed that, like St. Peter and the apostles, they fearlessly proclaim Christ to the world.

Then on Saturday, May 3, the second grade St. Peter day school and the St. Julie and St. Peter PSR classes made their first Holy Communion. May these young people continue to welcome Christ in the Eucharist. He is the food that fortifies our earthly journey and leads us to our heavenly homeland.

As Mary herself proclaimed in Luke 1:48, For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness; behold, from now on all ages will call me blessed. Relying on her motherly care and prayers, and seeking to imitate her lowliness and obedience, let us follow Jesus ever more closely.

### Our Ukrainian Welcome Circle

While we were touched by the Easter message from the family, they also were moved and very grateful for the gifts and personal messages/cards you sent to them.

Even though threats from the administration to the immigration status of Ukrainians have been quieter in the last few weeks, the situation remains a very unstable for the Bryiovskyis.

At this moment, the Bryiovskyis are allowed to stay in the US until the end of this year as that will be the end of their original humanitarian parole status. They continue to work with an immigration lawyer to determine how they can/will proceed as new Executive orders are issued and ICE activity continues to change.

We are staying in touch with other Welcome Circles to see how they are doing with their families. All are in the same boat. We all remain vigilant.

As for the Bryiovskyis' day to day....... Because the CDL license training takes 2-3 months, and it currently appears the Bryiovskyis will be here only until the end of their parole period in December, Vitalii will remain in his mechanic's job and not pursue the CDL truck driver license. This was an especially difficult decision. His temporary CDL license that allows him to take the training expires in December. So, if there is positive change regarding their humanitarian parole, he will still be able to sign up.

The kids are doing great! The boys are really enjoying school this year and Susiana spends lots of time with Nadiia and loves helping around the house.

As we continue our journey alongside the family, our support does not change. We are still committed to do all we can until the end of the humanitarian parole in December. We will continue to monitor the everchanging immigration landscape and provide needed support. We pray that the coming months offer some relief from the emotional roller coaster and hope for their future. We need to remember something that Nadiia and Vitalii told us... It's in God's hands now.

Thank you for all of the help you have provided and we continue to rely on you. We encourage you to contact your representatives as you have done before to keep this issue in front of them. Of course, the power of prayer at this unstable time cannot be underestimated.
