

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

Last week was an eventful one. As always, November begins with two special days. First, All Saints Day. It is a day to celebrate all the saints who have finished their earthly race by gaining their heavenly reward. They now cheer for us, pray for us and model for us how to gain the prize. It is also a day that we remember our own calling: to be saints!

November 2 is All Souls Day. We pray for our deceased loved ones, assisting them with our Masses, prayers, and sacrifices. Pope St. John Paul II spoke our prayers and sacrifices assisting the souls of the faithful departed by helping to free them from undue earthly attachments. His description of purgatory was not so much doing time to make reparation for sin. He described purgatory as the place that liberates the soul for full union with God. C. S. Lewis referred to purgatory as the perfecting school of heaven. In heaven, we will love each other without the hang-ups and hurts that affect our relationships. Purgatory gets us ready for those kinds of loving relationships. November 2, and really this whole month, is a special time to pray for our deceased loved ones. As we do so, let us tend our own garden, seeking to earnestly live our faith, loving as Christ has taught, with the hope of heaven.

On Sunday, November 5 I was officially installed as the third pastor of St. Julie Parish. It was a time of encouragement for the people of St. Julie Parish and for me. I am grateful to the people of St. Julie Parish, especially the Parish Council, making the liturgy and reception so joyful and meaningful.
