


PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners.

I am deeply grateful for everyone who made our Holy Week and Easter services reverent and joy-filled liturgies. There were people who cleaned, decorated, played musical instruments, sang, presided and served in various ways. We fittingly honored the death and resurrection of the Lord. Thank you and may God's name be praised!

This Second Sunday of Easter is now referred to as Divine Mercy Sunday. Based on the revelations of our Lord to St. Faustina, the events and readings of this Sunday highlight the mercy, which as Pope Francis said, is the face of God in his first encyclical.

One special way we will be celebrating Divine Mercy is by having a Divine Mercy Holy Hour this afternoon at St. Peter Parish. The Eucharistic Holy Hour will begin at 3:00 p.m. During this time of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament there will be a short reflection on Divine Mercy, silence, a Litany of Mercy, the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction. All are welcome to honor our Lord's mercy from 3:00-4:00 p.m. this afternoon.

St. Julie Parish is looking for a few new gardeners to oversee planting flowers in a number of the flower beds around the parish. This labor of love beautifies our campus and truly enhances the prayerful atmosphere of our parish grounds. There are two ways to join our team of gardeners. As Pope Francis reminds us, our parishes need to be "islands of mercy in the midst of the sea of indifference." Our own Walking with Moms in Need initiative will help individual parishioners and our parishes as a whole be ready to assist moms in need.

A number of weeks ago we had a joint parish meeting on The Welcome Circle to sponsor a family from Ukraine. Both parish councils were agreeable to press forward in seeking to do this. Right now a smaller core group of interested parties from St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes are interviewing Welcome Circle members of other parishes to see what their experience has been like. meeting in the near future to finalize our decision. I will publish that meeting date as soon as it has been set.





REFLECT

Each year, on the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy, remembering the message Jesus so ardently instructed St. Faustina to spread of His endless mercy and forgiveness to those who seek it. Rooted in Christ's message of Divine Mercy is *trust*: trust that Jesus loves us, desires to heal our souls, and is with us.

This is an especially important message for expectant mothers preparing for the births of their children. They may often be gripped by fear and anxiety, without sources of support. May we prayerfully consider how we are called to help mothers who may be struggling in a particular way. And in our own lives, each of us is invited to come to Jesus just as we are and lay our cares, fears, and anxieties upon Him. The words Christ revealed to St. Faustina, He speaks to us and all who feel afraid: "Lay your head on my shoulder, rest and regain your strength. I am always with you" (Diary, no. 848). As we seek to live out the message of Divine Mercy, we pray for the courage for all to proclaim, "Jesus, I trust in you!"

ACT (choose one)

- Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy (<u>usccb.org/divine-mercy-chaplet</u>) at 3:00 pm, the Hour of Mercy, for expectant mothers.
- Jesus spoke to St. Faustina, "Reveal all the wounds of your heart. I will heal them" (Diary, no. 1487). Expose the cuts and wounds of your heart to Christ and allow His healing mercy to reach every hurt and hidden pain through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for the featured intention.




