Dear Parishioners.

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost, the third greatest liturgical feast on our calendar. Why is this such a big deal? With the coming of the Holy Spirit, God's whole plan is activated. Peter and the Apostles understood the plan in Jesus Christ. They were granted courage to proclaim the good news that God's Son, the Word made Flesh, was crucified by and for sinners, and is raised from the dead. By the Spirit they were able to lay aside their own agendas and love each other as they implemented God's plan.

The Holy Spirit is still moving in our day. When we are weak, He brings us strength. When we are dull, He brings us light. When we are bound, He brings us true freedom. To the degree we cooperate with the Spirit, we grow the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

More than just a liturgical celebration, Pentecost is an ongoing reality that is to permeate our lives. Church life, home life, work life, leisure time: all of this is to be animated by the Holy Spirit. Let us continually pray that the Holy Spirit brings us light, courage, and unity as we proclaim Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father.

The liturgies over the next month unveil the fruits of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Again, the first fruit is the gift of the Holy Spirit which we celebrate today. And it is the Spirit who unveils the other fruits.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. We can reason our way to the existence of God. That we know that there is One God in a Trinity of Persons: that is the gift of the Holy Spirit.

June 2nd, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. That we have the real Presence of Jesus under the appearances of bread and wine is the work of the Holy Spirit. And yes, on Sunday afternoon on June 2nd, St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes will join together for an outdoor Procession with the Blessed Sacrament from St. Peter Parish to St. Julie Parish. This procession will begin at the end of the Noon Mass at St. Peter Parish and will finish at St. Julie Parish with a brief period of Adoration, Benediction, and a social.

Later in June we will celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Again, we understand the Hearts of Jesus and Mary by the working of the Holy Spirit.

Though the Easter Season ends today, the fruits of our Lent and Easter celebrations are made evident in our lives by the Holy Spirit. Less than two weeks ago, while celebrating Mass at North Ridge Healthcare Center, I taught the residents a prayer to prepare for Pentecost. This three—word prayer goes: Holy Spirit, come! It is not simply a prayer offered as we approach Pentecost. This is a prayer that is to be offered each day. We need the Holy Spirit to saturate our thinking, speaking, and acting.

As we celebrate Pentecost and liturgically move into "Ordinary Time," let us remember. Ordinary does not mean blah. It means ordered by God's will and power. It is time animated by the Holy Spirit! So let us pray, Holy Spirit, come...into my life, family, workplace, and world! By God's grace, we will be agents of renewal in our world.

The Proxession & Adoration

Beginning at St. Peter Catholic Church the route will proceed going east on Center Ridge to Emerald, to Pearl, to Opal, to Julie Lane.

Two stops for brief prayer will be made along the route. Water will be available.

Silent Time for Prayer and Adoration, Daytime Prayer, and Benediction will take place at St. Julie Billiart at the end of the Eucharistic Procession.

Reception to follow at St. Julie Billiart.

Parishioners may park at either parish. The Eucharistic Procession will begin at St. Peter Catholic Church at 1:00pm.

Following the Eucharistic Procession a shuttle will be available at St. Julie in order to begin returning to St. Peter around 3:00pm.


