

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioner,

Last Saturday a number of our children had donuts with Santa. It was kind of Santa to make time for us at St. Julie Parish. I want to thank Kelly Reed, Jill Papesch and Dave Davis for organizing our teenagers, in particular our Confirmation students, to make this event a success.

I regret not being able to visit Donuts with Santa. After greeting the Following Christ retreat at St. Peter's, I pick up a phone message on my voice mail and heard that our founding pastor Fr. Gonser was in UH Elyria Memorial Hospital. I had to wait my turn as he was first being evaluated by the physical therapy team and then interviewed by a doctor. Fr. Gonser was in good spirits. However, due to weakness in his legs, it looks like he will be going to a rehab facility for some therapy. Please keep him in your prayers. Fr. Gonser has often reminded his brother priests in Lorain County that he is our eldest brother.

As you may have noticed, St. Julie Parish has a new music director. Her name is Mary Pokrywka. Mary oversees choirs for the Sheffield-Sheffield Village School System for both the Middle School and High School. She previously served as a music director at St. Bernadette Parish. Besides bringing a lovely voice and keyboard skills, Mary is a very experienced choir director. She has a working knowledge of our Oregon Catholic Press hymnal called *Breaking Bread* and its digital expressions.

I am very grateful that Mary Pokrywka has accepted the position as Music Director at St. Julie Parish. She and her husband Rich, along with their three children, live in Sheffield Lake.

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. The readings highlight joy because we are more than halfway through Advent and the Lord is near. As Isaiah the prophet proclaims: I rejoice heartily in the LORD, in my God is the joy of my soul. St. Paul adds to this his exhortations: Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus.

How can we grow in joy? We have some direction given in our gospel, which again presents us with St. John the Baptist. Perhaps in our day he would be a media sensation. After clearly denying that he was not the Christ, Elijah or the Prophet, John the Baptist declares that he is The Voice. John is the voice not because he sings so well, but because his voice prepares the way for The Word, Jesus Christ, the Word made Flesh.

Joy is a by-product of listening to the voice John the Baptist and embracing the Word made Flesh, Jesus Christ. Later in this gospel, John calls himself the Bridegroom's friend. And John rejoices in that role. He proclaims that He must increase and I must decrease. These words highlight the path to joy. The more that Christ can influence our lives, the greater our joy will be. (continued)

As we approach the coming Christmas Season, let us continue to seek out the Lord. As we celebrate the coming of Light that scatters the darkness of our world, let us seek to be polished mirrors who reflect the truth, love and wisdom of the Lord into our world that seems, at times, so confused and cold.

I have added confessions at St. Julie Parish the week before Christmas. There will be confession on Wednesday, December 20 from 3:00-4:00 p.m. and 7:00-8:00 p.m. This is in addition to the 3:30-4:30 p.m. time on Saturday, December 23.

Finally, please look over the Mass schedule for next weekend. As practicing Catholics, we are to celebrate both the 4th Sunday of Advent as well as Christmas. There are three usual Masses for the 4th Sunday of Advent: 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. on Sunday morning. Then, that Sunday afternoon (which is Christmas Eve), St. Julie will begin the Christmas Masses. Those Masses are: 5:00 and 10:00 p.m. On Monday, Christmas Day, Masses are at 9:00 & 11:00 a.m. All are welcome!
