Dear Parishioners.

Today is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Church throughout the world honors the real and true presence of Jesus in the consecrated bread and the consecrated wine, the Eucharist.

The real and true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist has always been with us. However, our understanding has grown through the ages. The two major realities of the Eucharist (sacrifice and nourishment) have been our tradition since the first century. St. Paul said, "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes." (I Corinthians 11:26). This intimates the sacrificial nature of the Eucharist. Jesus said at the Last Supper, Take and eat...this is My Body...take and drink...This is the cup of My Blood and Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. (John 6:53) This is the nourishing/feeding reality of the Eucharist.

The writings of the early Church (second century through the seventh century) confirm our faith that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. Sometime around the 8th-9th century, theologians began to describe the "how" of the Eucharist. How is it that bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ? Somewhere around the Twelfth century the word "transubstantiation" began to be used to describe the bread and wine becoming the body and blood of Christ.

During this period of time, Eucharistic Miracles occurred. On the one hand, we could argue that every celebration of the Eucharist is a miracle. However, Eucharistic miracles in this context means that when the priest celebrates the Eucharist, the consecrated Bread begins to look like real flesh. One such miracle is described by the Catholic newspaper, The National Catholic Register:

The Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano, located in the region of Abruzzo (Italy), is par excellence the most well-known in the Catholic Church. The miracle took place in the eighth century in a church administered by Basilian monks. ... One of the priests was doubting the Real Presence. As he pronounced the consecration, the host was transformed into flesh, the wine into blood. The Body took on the form of a heart, and the Blood coagulated into five irregularly shaped globules.

In 1970, the miracle was subjected to scientific scrutiny. The doctors concluded that the flesh was human heart tissue, and the blood is human. Both are from the same blood group, AB. Today, the relics are conserved in a Franciscan church. While it is often difficult to discern details of other Eucharistic miracles, Lanciano is unique. Close access is possible thanks to a stairway immediately behind the relics. The flesh is preserved within a silver monstrance, the blood globules in a crystal chalice. (www.nationalcatholicregister.com Blessed Carlos Acutis Top 5)

These miracles inspired a third major reality regarding the Eucharist. It is not only a sacrifice and meal. The Eucharist is also a source of adoration.

In our parish today is a poster board giving information about some of the Eucharistic miracles that have been documented over the centuries. Blessed Carlos Acutis was one of the great promoters of Eucharistic miracles. He died at the age of 15 of leukemia in 2005. He built a website that documents these Eucharistic miracles and will be canonized on September 7, 2025.

I hope that this feast day, as well as the procession from St. Peter Parish to St. Julie Parish this afternoon, deepen our understanding and devotion to the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. May this gift of Christ's ongoing presence be a source of strength and hope for all who share in His sacrifice, welcome Him in Holy Communion, and adore Him in this most Blessed Sacrament.






