The Most Holy Trinity

Dear Parishioners,

By the time you read the bulletin, another school year will be in the books. North Ridgeville City Schools and St. Peter ended their school year on Thursday, May 23. Other school districts will be finishing in short order. I want to extend a word of congratulations to those in the graduating classes of 2024. May your next steps in life, whether that is pursuing more education or entering the work force, be blessed by the Lord. When Joshua was about to lead God's people into the Promised Land, the Lord spoke to him: ...be strong and steadfast! Do not fear nor be dismayed, for the LORD, your God, is with you wherever you go. (Joshua 1:9) May our graduates forge ahead in the name of the Lord.

Pastorally, we have a number of really good things going on between St. Julie and St. Peter Parishes. The first thing will be next weekend, which is the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Our parishes will be joining together again to process with the Blessed Sacrament after the Noon Mass at St. Peter Parish to St. Julie Parish. We will walk east on Center Ridge Road and cross over to Emerald Street and wind our way to Opal Street. We will enter St. Julie property at the rectory and walk down beautiful Julie Lane and into the church. There we will spend some time in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We will conclude with the Liturgy of the Hours, Mid -Afternoon Prayer, and Benediction. This will be followed by a social.

If you are wondering, "How do I get back to St. Peter's to pick up my car?", we have you covered. We were able to rent a bus (and driver) from North Ridgeville City Schools to drive people back to the St. Peter parking lot.

Please plan to participate in this procession. It is a great way to honor Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and publicly witness to our faith. You may join the procession at any point along the way. If you are not able to walk the procession, simply go to St. Julie church around 2:00 p.m. and participate in the short time of adoration, Midday Prayer, Benediction, and the social.

There are two other pastoral initiatives that our parishes will be doing designed to help us grow in our faith and share it with others. The first is a seven-week video series on Jesus and the Eucharist. This series will be on Monday evenings at St. Julie Parish and Wednesday afternoons at St. Peter Parish. And fret not if you will miss a week or two because you are traveling. Just come to as many of the sessions as you can and deepen your faith. Details are tucked away in this bulletin.

The second pastoral initiative is this: St. Peter and St. Julie parishioners will be teaming up to visit the over 2600 Catholic households that comprise our parishes. Our goal is simply to drop off a bag that contains information about the Mass and the activities of our parishes. It is our prayer that as we reach out to our fellow Catholics, many of whom are on our books but do not participate in Mass or parish life, we will be able to bring some of them back to the practice of their faith.

And the most immediate event of the summer is this: Memorial Day! There will be only one Mass in North Ridgeville on Monday, May 27. That Mass will be at 9:00 a.m. in the St. Peter Parish Cemetery, weather permitting. We will be gathering in the small parking area behind the parish center. At the end of the Mass we will pray for the deceased in our cemetery with a rite of blessing. Please bring a lawn chair. If the weather is inclement, Mass will be celebrated in St. Peter Church.

Last weekend St. Julie parishioners elected three parishioners to the St. Julie Parish Council. Those elected were: Christine Sinclair, Jim Nolan, and David Rodriguez. Congratulations! A special word of thanks for the other parishioners who also ran for council: Helen Gaskey, Bob Esper, John Polak, and Ray Sharron. Your willingness to serve your fellow parishioners is deeply appreciated. Finally, thank you, parishioners of St. Julie Parish for your participation in this election.

Finally, this weekend we celebrate The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. God, the origin of all that is, is also our eternal destiny. God has revealed Himself as Three Persons in One God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And God is personal with us. Jesus Christ, the Word made Flesh, reveals the Father, and pours out the Holy Spirit. The Holy Trinity is not an insolvable math problem. God is a mystery revealed that is to inspire a holy manner of life until we see God face to face.

There will be a prayer service at St. Julie's with cookies and juice afterward.


A school bus will take people back to St. Peter's.

PSR Model Option Explanations



Model One: Regular Formation Sessions Students meet regularly in classrooms with catechist on a weekly basiss for 75 minutes. Although we are not large enough and do not have enough helpers to provide everyone's first choice we are hoping to meet the majority of parishoners needs based on these survey results. Choices include the following for non-sacramental years:

- 1. SUNDAY-PSR at 9:30 AM
- 2. SUNDAY-All PSR at 6:30 PM
- 3. SUNDAY-K-5 at 9:30 AM and 6-8 at 6:30 PM

Model Two: Family PSR Home Instruction

The Family at Home Model is a unique program that combines various events and a Home Guide to assist parents in incorporating faith into their home life and helping their children navigate the curriculum. It also offers online resources related to family life and spirituality. Every two months, families participate in events that focus on family catechesis and knowledge sharing. During half of these events, families learn about unit themes together through activities and faith discussions. The other half of the events allows children to showcase their understanding by sharing about their favorite lessons and tasks from the units. This format offers busy families the flexibility to integrate faith education into their schedules, with support, materials, and planning assistance provided during the family meetings.

Model Three: Summer Intensive PSR The Concentrated Summer Catechesis program offers either a 1-week full-day option or a 2-week half-day option, focusing on basic catechesis for nonsacramental years. The curriculum includes a variety of activities, prayer methods, liturgical experiences, and hands-on activities to promote immersion in the faith. Participants will have the chance to integrate life and faith through activities like reflection, service, witnessing, scripture study, and multimedia lessons. The program also includes six bi-monthly meetings covering topics such as the Creed, Church Feasts and Seasons, Prayer, Liturgy, Morality, and Catholic Social Teaching with a focus on service. Parents are encouraged to consider this new and engaging religious education format for their children that covers the bulk of faith formation in the summer with six follow up meetings spaced throughout the school year.

Sacramental Preparation

St. Julie's sacramental preparation will be held during the regular school year September through May. Second Grade Sundays at 9:30 AM and Confirmation on Sundays at 6:30 PM. These times are already set. We are conducting this survey to see what needs and possibilities our parisioners are interested. There are three possible models and with enough interest all could be available next PSR year.
