


### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

### From the Desk of Father George

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

On Thursday, February 3<sup>rd</sup>, the church celebrated the Feast of Saint Blaise. As a people of faith, we know more about the devotion to St. Blaise by Christians around the world than we know about the saint himself. We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in the city of Sebaste, Armenia, in 316. However, it was not until four hundred years later that the accounts of his 'actions' were put into writing. Blaise was remembered as a good bishop who worked hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. But as is often the case, there were then, as there are now, persons who did not want his type around. And so, Blaise was forced to flee to the back country area where he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer. It is according to legend that one day a group of hunters came across Blaise kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions, and bears. As the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came to him with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. Upon Blaise's command, the child coughed up the bone and was rescued from his condition and near death. Once in Sebaste, Agricolaus, the governor of Cappadocia, tried to force Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. Blaise refused and was tortured mercilessly. In the end, after having been beaten and then hung from a tree while his flesh was torn from his body, he was beheaded, suffering a martyr's death.

As a people who struggle with suffering and illness, we should pray not only for God's healing grace in our life journey, but also for the courage to bear the pain or suffering with the faith of one whose eyes are focused upon the things of heaven. The blessing of the sick is an ancient custom, rooted in imitation of Christ and his apostles. In the United States the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian.

This weekend, the gospel recounts Jesus getting into the boat of Simon, and after teaching the crowds, he directs them to "put out into deep water and lower their nets for a catch." Trusting in Jesus' words, they follow his command and "when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their nets were tearing... Astonishment seized them all and Jesus said: 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

Have <u>you</u> been caught by the words of Jesus? How do you need to be healed? Embrace this day and every day as an opportunity to do great things through God's grace.

The blessing of throats will be available after all the Masses this weekend.

Synodality is the People of God walking together summoned by the Lord Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit. How can we "walk together?"


We will conduct "listening sessions" using Scripture reflection, prayer and sharing. Some questions we may consider are:






