From the desk of Fr. George...

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

I can be certain that we have had persons in our lives that come and go. It may have been in grade school or college... or in another city or state where we once lived, but time has placed a distance between us, or we have completely lost contact with them. And there may also have been relationships that ended on a sour note with harsh words or deeply hurt feelings.

In the Gospel parables offered this weekend, Christ calls each of us to the hard work of repairing broken relationships, and of restoring community in the wake of division and dysfunction. There is joy in finding, discovering, or welcoming someone or something that was once lost. Imagine yourself as the one welcomed, discovered or found after you were 'lost.' Imagine the joy of being the one who welcomes, finds, or discovers someone or something that was lost. God's desire for every one of us is that we may never be lost or unloved. Instead of running from God (or for that matter our friends and our problems), stop and face up to the situation or person. Remember, it is by God's grace that we are restored.

Today, our nation remembered the events of the terrorist attacks on 9/11. Take time to continue to pray for the victims and their families of that horrible day in our history. Reach out to someone in need. Pray for an old friend - someone who has caused hurt or sadness in your life. Our losses may be numerous, but the hope of faith will heal. And always remember our first responders, firefighters, police and military men and women.

Men's Breakfast










When you go outside to play at school, look for someone who is alone. Offer to be a friend and play together.


Dear God, help me to show kindness like Jesus did.






When I hurt others, I will say, "I am sorry. Will you forgive me?"
