Mary the Holy Mother of God

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

As we begin a New Year, I need to say something about how the last year ended. Please forgive me!

I feel badly that there was no 10:00 pm Mass at St. Julie's on Christmas Eve. Fr. Dan Schlegel and I spoke a number of times about the Mass schedule for Christmas. Unfortunately, there was some miscommunication. I said something to the effect that I had the 10:00 pm Mass. And I did have the 10:00 pm Mass-at St. Peter Parish! He thought that I had the 10:00 pm Mass at St. Julie Parish. Since he had a mid-night Mass at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Lorain, he was glad that he did not have to sandwich another Mass into his schedule. And to make things a bit more confusing, I had taken my phones (personal and emergency line) out of my pocket before I began Mass at St. Peter Parish on Christmas Eve. Suzanne Snyder, sacristan extraordinaire, tried calling. However, I did not have the phones with me

I am deeply sorry for the inconvenience this caused many of you. I will do my best to make sure that this does not happen again.

One more note about the Mass schedule. Going forward, Fr. Isidore and I will be alternating weekends at St. Julie Parish. Next weekend I will have all the Masses at St. Julie's. The following weekend, Fr. Isidore will have all the Masses at St. Julie's. There will be some variation when either of us take a vacation. However, this will be the basic pattern.

Mass during the week will resume at St. Julie Parish on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday beginning this Monday, January 2nd at 5:30 pm. We will be using the main church for this Mass. There are not many evening Masses in the area. My desire is to serve people who want to attend Mass but are prevented by their work schedules from participating in a morning Mass. We asked neighboring parishes to publish this Mass time in their bulletins.

Today's readings actually cover the three things we remember on this day. First, we begin a New Year. Secondly, the official title of this day is The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Finally, we recall the event that took place on the eighth day after the birth of Jesus.


Our gospel reading covers the events of the octave of Christmas: the naming of the baby and his circumcision. Joseph named the baby Jesus, highlighting both the mission of Jesus (the name means *the Lord saves*) and his role. By the act of naming the child, Joseph is taking on the role of being Jesus' father on earth. Our second reading reminds us that, "When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman." (Galatians 4:4) Mary rightly has the title *Mother of God* because God's Son is of the same substance of the Father, making Him divine. Jesus, one Person with two natures (human and divine) is God. Therefore, we can rightly say that Mary is *Mother of God*.

Finally, our first reading gives us what is called the Aaronic Blessing:

The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The LORD look upon you kindly and give you peace!

May this blessing be with us all as we begin 2023!
