Dear Parishioners.

For many students, this week marks the beginning of the end. School resumes in North Ridgeville this Wednesday and Thursday. It is the end of summer vacation, the end of sleeping in, the end of staying up late.

However, we might do better if we thought of this week as the beginning of the beginning. Students embrace a new school year and along with that year comes many new and exciting things. Our minds are made for truth. A new school year brings exposure to new learning experiences. It also brings opportunities to renew acquaintances and make new friends. And of course, there will be new opportunities for extracurricular activities such as CYO sports, the Lego Club, the Chess Club, and a host of other ways to learn and grow.

Join me in praying for students, teachers, and school staff as they embrace the school year 2024-2025. Pray that the Holy Spirit stirs up a hunger for truth in the minds and hearts of our young people. It is my hope that this hunger for truth leads them to a deepening faith in Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life. I pray that they also learn the truth and beauty that comes through an academic curriculum of arts and sciences.

While on a retreat/meeting in Morristown, New Jersey during the week of August 4-10, my phone alerted me of a tornado watch for North Ridgeville. My "go to" prayer for these sorts of things comes from Night Prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours. Prayed twice during Night Prayer, this prayer frames what is called Simeon's Canticle. It goes:

Protect us Lord, as we stay awake. Watch over us as we sleep. That awake we may keep watch with Christ and asleep, rest in your peace.

I am grateful that North Ridgeville was spared from the damaging effects of these tornados. Let us pray for those whose lives have been negatively impacted by these storms. We pray that their lives and property can be completely restored in a timely manner.

I did participate in a weather event on Friday afternoon of that week. I left New Jersey for central New York to stay with family I have in Oswego, NY. My trip took me through the torrential rains of the remnant of Hurricane Debbie. Though there were times I felt like I was driving in a carwash, I only had to pass through one slightly flooded road. Praise God for his mercies never end.

The Paris Olympics wrapped up last Sunday. Though I did not see much of the Olympics, what I did see, I enjoyed. I did hear about the opening ceremony. The words of St. Paul come to mind:

Make no mistake: God is not mocked, for a person will reap only what he sows, because the one who sows for his flesh will reap corruption from the flesh, but the one who sows for the spirit will reap eternal life from the spirit.

Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity, let us do good to all, but especially to those who belong to the family of the faith. (Galatians 6:7-10)

To mock the holy is to invite judgement on oneself. In this time of Eucharistic Revival in the United States, let us pray that our awe and wonder of the Real and True Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, stands against the cynical mockery of people who claim to be wise, but are fools.

In today's gospel reading from John 6:51-60, Jesus underscores the necessity of feeding on His Flesh and Blood. Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. (John 6:53-54)

May our devout reception of Holy Communion nourish in us a holy way of life, doing acts of charity to all, especially to our brothers and sisters in Christ.




