

3rd Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioner

Lent is the season of joining in Jesus' time of prayer and fasting in the desert. We embrace the practices of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting in a more intentional manner. However, one of the goals of doing penance is repentance, meaning a change of heart and mind that reconciles us to God and one another. And one of the best ways to enter into repentance is through the sacrament of reconciliation.

Last Wednesday, I joined hundreds of priests in the Diocese of Cleveland to hear confessions for three hours on Wednesday evening. Though this stretches our stamina a bit, most of us are glad to do this. Helping people experience the forgiveness and mercy of God is what we priests are made for.

If you have not yet gone to confession this Lent, I encourage you to do so. There will be a number of opportunities to celebrate this sacrament between now and Easter. One special time to go to confession will be this Sunday, March 23 at 3:00 p.m. at St. Julie Parish. This is our annual joint communal penance service. Individual confessions will be heard after a brief prayer service and examination of conscience. All are welcome!

One concrete way of embracing the Lenten practices of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting is to assist with the St. Julie-St. Peter Ukrainian Welcome Circle. In this bulletin, there is an update on the Bryiovskyi family and how we can assist them. Check it out.

Our joint parish mission is around the corner. This year's parish mission will be a bit different. Frank Runyon, an Emmy nominated Hollywood actor and devout Catholic, will be presenting gospel stories. Details are in this bulletin. Please make participation in this mission a priority. You will not regret it.

I need to take a moment to give a shout out to Tom Gimmartino, our part time maintenance person. He spent a good part of his winter labors painting the halls and door frames of the St. Julie educational wing. This involved repairing the walls, lots of taping, trimming, and then rolling. Thank you, Tom, for sprucing up our educational wing.

Today's readings are both practical and prophetic. Our first reading highlights things we all should know well-The Ten Commandments. Whether we know them well or not, I do believe that we could all live these commandments better! One way to examine our conscience is to deeply reflect on these commandments and ask, "Am I living these commandments?" It would be a great way to prepare for the Sacrament of Penance.

The gospel presents us with a prophetic act of Jesus. The cleansing of the Temple shows us that Jesus wants the Church, and each member of the Church: to be a holy dwelling. We have been created to worship God. However, we are easily preoccupied with the things of the world. He desires to cleanse us. Jesus also uses this opportunity to tell us, in a veiled way, that He is the Temple, crucified and raised on the third day. Let us seek to be his living stones!



If you or someone you know is facing an unwanted or problem pregnancy, both Birthright and Cornerstone will provide a pregnancy test, on-going support, maternity and baby clothes, prenatal classes, community assistance referrals, and adoption counseling. In addition, Cornerstone also provides limited ultrasound exams. All services provided at both centers are free, non-judgemental, and confidential.

Also, <u>Walking With Moms in Need</u> of St. Julie Billiart and St. Peter parishes in North Ridgeville has compiled an Inventory of Local Pregnancy Help and Family Assistance resources for women raising children. <u>Walking with Moms</u> volunteers are eager to journey with moms and help connect them with the resources they may need. You can pray directly for those considering abortion by joining with fellow St. Julie Billiart parishioners each Thursday during 40 Days for Life to pray at the Planned Parenthood abortion mill in Bedford Heights from 12noon to 1pm. Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am. Or, if you can't make it to Planned Parenthood, you can pray with fellow parishioners in the church, also on Thursday from 12noon to 1pm.

The Rosary Group meets to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm at the church followed by Eucharistic Adoration in the church from 2-5pm.

Each Monday, St. Peter Parish participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm. Those going to the Preterm abortion facility leave at 11:10 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot. Those praying at St Peter Church meet at the church at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025, when we enter the 40 days of preparation for Easter. This is a season of repentance, and we are called to fast, to pray and to give alms. The activities, events, and prayer opportunities available at **St. Julie Billiart (SJB)** and **St. Peter (SP)** Catholic Churches, as indicated, are meant to be suggestions to assist in living out the Lenten

ASH WEDNESDAY

Lent begins with us hearing the words, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." Ashes will be distributed March 5th during Masses at:

SP: 8:15 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. SJB: 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (only one meal) and abstinence (refrain from meat).

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

During Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through fasting, abstinence and prayer.

- We fast on the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday, and the day Christ died for us, Good Friday. Fasting is for those age 18 to 59, unless you are pregnant or have an illness that could cause harm, e.g., diabetes. When we fast, only one full meal should be eaten that day. Two smaller meals could be eaten but they should not exceed one full meal.
- When we abstain from meat, we are voluntarily giving up something good, for our spiritual benefit. The practice of Abstinence is for everyone over the age of 14 on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent.



Come and meditate on the final steps of Jesus as he journeyed to Calvary through the Stations of the Cross. We pray the **Stations every Friday in Lent at SJB: 12:00 p.m. and SP: 7:00 p.m.**


