

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners,

It's cold. And I am grateful. It is not that I like cold weather. I am grateful that I am alive in the 21st century. I am blessed to live in a prosperous country. And barring an unforeseen catastrophe, I have warm clothes, warm places to work and live and a warm car (after it warms up!) I hope that you can be grateful too. And let us pray for and labor on behalf of those whose lives are severely impacted by the cold. Let us support those who help people affected by the cold. Although warming the chilled is not categorized as a corporal work of mercy, I believe it falls under clothing the naked. On these cold days, let us be grateful for the ways we can keep warm and help those who are less fortunate.

Today, throughout the United States, we begin Catholic Schools Week. During this week Catholic schools celebrate their achievements and promote their schools. If you are parents of elementary school age children and have questions about a Catholic elementary education, I invite you to call Amy Reitz at St. Peter School at 440-327-3212.

St. Peter is hosting a Pre-Baptism class this Wednesday, January 28 at 7:00 PM in the Galilee Room of the Parish Center. Next month this class will be at St. Julie Parish on Wednesday, February 25 at 7:00 PM in the Holy Family Room. I am encouraged by the number of young couples starting families and seeking to have their children baptized. May God's blessings be on families!

Last week one of our parishioners came up to me after Mass and ask me if we had any Catholic bible studies currently taking place in the parish. Between St. Peter Parish and St. Julie Parish, there are several small groups studying the bible in their homes and other settings. However, we do not currently have an ongoing bible study in either parish. I referred this person to the Fr. Michael Schmitz Bible in a Year podcast. It is a great way to acquaint oneself with the whole bible.

The fact that we Catholics are looking for bible studies tells me that we are trending in the right direction. Throughout the 20th century and especially since Vatican II, there has been a growing emphasis on bible reading for Catholics. We need to read the bible to feed our souls and deepen our relationship with Christ.

On September 30, 2019 (feast of St. Jerome, Doctor of the Church and Fourth Century scripture scholar who said "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ"), Pope Francis declared that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time be declared Word of God Sunday. Pope Francis stated that this Sunday is "to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God." (Aperuit Illiis #3)

Today we celebrate Word of God Sunday. The title of Pope Francis' document Aperuit Illiis comes from Luke 24:45, which states "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures". Let us pray that Jesus opens our minds to better understand and live His words.



Qualified Charitable Contributions

Charitable Gifts from an IRA

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

- **Eligibility:** Individuals aged 70½ or older can make QCDs from their IRAs.
- **Annual Limit:** Up to \$108,000 can be donated per year, or \$216,000 for married couples filing jointly.
- **Tax Benefits:** QCDs are not included in taxable income, which can help lower your adjusted gross income (AGI) and potentially reduce taxes on Social Security benefits and Medicare premiums.

Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs)

- **RMD Age:** Starting at age 73, IRA owners must take annual RMDs. QCDs can satisfy all or part of this requirement.
- **Direct Transfers:** The donation must be made directly from the IRA to a qualified charity. Donors cannot receive the funds first.


