


#### PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Parishioners.

The weather in November can be a bit dismal. The days grow shorter. The air is chillier. The clouds are thicker. Our deciduous trees drop their leaves and go dormant. In a sense, nature is reminding us of our mortality.

Though we know that one day we will die, we do not always keep that end in mind. Many people in our time live as if their earthly life has no eternal consequences. Some people seek to be constantly amused. The technical term for this is hedonism. Other people value life only as long as they are useful or productive. This is called utilitarianism. And if one is no longer useful, why live? This can lead to euthanasia.

Christians realize that their lives count in the sight of God. Our thoughts, words, actions, intentions, and motives are all seen by God. We seek to live in the light of Jesus Christ and by His grace. He is the judge of the living and the dead.

We enjoy life, but seek first God's Kingdom, knowing that He will provide what we need. We seek to be useful, but we know that we are human beings (not just human doers) who value life even in our sufferings and powerlessness.

This approach to life leads to how we approach death and the Catholic rituals that surround death. Many people simply want to have a "celebration of life" after they die. This approach can blunt the truth that we have a personal judgement after death. And that judgement will land us ultimately in either heaven or hell. If one is free from mortal sin but is not yet ready for the brightness of God, they will undergo a purification process traditionally called Purgatory. This is only for souls destined for heaven. Hell is for people who have made a definitive choice against God. Understanding these things ought to lead us to a more sober approach to life and death.

The traditional Catholic rituals regarding death normally include a time of visiting in the presence of the body/remains. This is accompanied by a prayer service in which we pray for the deceased and the grieving. The second and most important ritual is the Funeral Mass. We commend our deceased loved ones to the Lord praying that the saving graces of the Cross of Christ bring mercy to the imperfections of our immortal soul. The final ritual is the burial, where prayers are offered for the deceased and the grieving.

We pray for the deceased because we know that "without holiness no one will see the Lord." (Hebrews 12:14) Though the deceased can no longer pray on their own behalf, the Church on earth can pray for them, that they would be ready to enter the brightness of God's holy presence. Let us make it a point to pray for our deceased loved ones and ready ourselves for the day when we go to our Maker.



#### Reflection

Jesus not only loves unborn children — He was one himself! Think about this for a moment. We often hear people speak of a pregnant mother by saying, "She's expecting a child." Now if one is expecting a package, the package is not yet there. As reflected in our verse for today, however, this is not the case with the mother. Her gift is already there. The pregnant woman, a mother already, does not have a child "on the way," but has a child, already present and in full possession of his or her human rights, starting with the right to life.

#### **Prayer**

Jesus, open my eyes to your presence in the life of every child. Open my heart to joy in the birth of every child, a birth that reflects the joy of your own birth in Bethlehem. As you shared life in the womb of Mary, so now send your protection upon every child still in the womb, and grant to their mothers the strength and joy that comes from welcoming the gift of life. 
