

From the desk of Fr. Bob

Greetings Parishioners and friends of St. Julie's,

With the retirement of Fr. George, Bishop Malesic has appointed me administrator of St. Julie Parish. Before I say anything else, I want to encourage you to join me in prayer for Fr. George. As you know, his health issues are serious. He shared with me that he hopes to have two procedures/operations that may improve his health in the next few months. We pray that those will be scheduled in a timely manner and that they are effective in improving his health.

For many years I have approached priesthood through the lens of Psalm 100:2. It reads: Serve the Lord with gladness. (Coincidently, it also happens to be the motto of Bishop Malesic.) With this in mind, I hope to be of service to the people of St. Julie Parish. By God's grace may I live these inspired words of Sacred Scripture.

As many of you may remember, I served as the Administrator of St. Julie Parish four years ago in the fall of 2018. In some ways this is a Back to the Future event. However, things are different this time. In 2018, Father Andrew Hoover was assigned at St. Peter's and together we were able to assist with Mass help and other liturgical actions. Currently I am without a parochial vicar.

In the four years that have passed, the ranks of the priesthood in the Diocese of Cleveland have gotten thinner. And although I cannot recall the exact configuration of priests and parishes in Lorain County back then, I can speak to the present. There are seven priests in Lorain County who are the pastor/administrator of two parishes. And though there are now more retired priests than there were back then, some of our retirees are no longer able to do public ministry or have passed on to their eternal destiny.

The fact that seven priests are overseeing fourteen parishes in Lorain County alone may be a bit shocking for some people. However, these kinds of configuration (one priest with responsibility for two or more parishes) have been quite common in other parts of the United States and throughout the world. And though it is not ideal or desirable, it can be workable. So how do we make it work?

We need to remember-we are the church. By our baptism each Christian is called not only to be holy, but also to be part of the mission of the Church. (Continued above)

I encourage you, as your time permits, and with the gifts you have received, that you make St. Julie Parish a people who desire:


- to be a Christ-centered community




