

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioner,

On Saturday, October 7, the Hamas terrorist group launched an attack on Israel that killed 1,400 soldiers and civilians. They also took 199 hostages. Israel responded with bombing the Gaza strip with 6000 bombs in five days. Things have continued to spiral into destruction as both sides blame each other for escalating the conflict.

My Tuesday was spent between the St. Peter office and school, as well as a trip to St. Julie parish and O'Neill healthcare facility. Since my local travels included using my guitar (in the school and at the nursing home), I dropped by the St. Peter church a number of times during Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. I finally settled there for my regular Tuesday Holy Hour at 4:05 p.m. Each time I stopped by I was greatly encouraged by seeing the people of St. Peter Parish (and others) who embraced the call of Cardinal Pizzaballa, Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, to make Tuesday a day of prayer, fasting and abstinence for the end to these hostilities in the Holy Land. I pen these thoughts on Tuesday evening and I do not know what this situation will be like by the weekend. However, whether there is a fragile peace or raging hostilities, we need to continue to pray and sacrifice for earthly land of our Lord Jesus.

This Thursday is our monthly Outreach meal here at St. Julie's. This drive thru event really helps people who are running low on funds at the end of the month. St. Julie Parish participates with six other churches in North Ridgeville to provide a meal on the last seven days of the month. I am especially grateful for Joanne Pogros and her crew that do everything from shopping and cooking, to serving and clean-up. **Praise God from whom all blessings flow!**

This Wednesday is the monthly Pre-Baptism Class. Since it is an even month, the class will be held here at St. Julie Parish in the Holy Family Room at 7:00 p.m. Remember: if you are looking to baptize your first child, whether or not the child has been born, you will need to take a Pre-Baptism class. Please call the office to register.

Next Sunday is Priesthood Sunday. Fr. Isidore and I are grateful for our vocations as priests. We are especially grateful for your prayers. Together let us continue do what Jesus asked us to do: The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. (Matthew 9:37b-38)

In today's gospel, Jesus asked the question, Who's image is this and who's inscription? (Matthew 22:20b) He went on to teach that we should...repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God. (Matthew 22:21b)

As we draw nearer to the November election, let us heed these words of Jesus. Yes, we must give to Caesar and pay our taxes. However, there is a more profound Kingdom to which we belong. Human beings have been stamped with the image of God. We are bound to give ourselves to Him. We are also bound to labor for the protection of each and every child, born and unborn. They belong first to God. Our personal rights end where another person's rights begin. Knowing our accountability to God, let us vote No on Issue 1. We desire the protection of the unborn as well as pledge ourselves to help women who need assistance during and after their pregnancy. (continued)



All Souls' Day

The Feast of All Souls, or All Souls' Day, is a day set apart for honoring all who have died. In Mexico, this feast is commonly known as The Day of the Dead. The official name for this feast in the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church is: The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. It is celebrated on November 2nd and is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation. It is often confused with All Saints' Day, which IS a Holy Day of Obligation. While the two feasts are somewhat related, they do, in fact, have their differences.

There is a Mexican saying that people die three times: the first is when they die; the second is when they are buried; and the third is when they are forgotten. Celebrating All Souls' Day is one way to never forget those who have gone before us.

GET THE FACTS

The November Election is NOT what you think.



The proposed abortion amendment is <u>RADICAL!</u>
If passed it will ...



1. REMOVE PARENTS' RIGHTS

The initiative's language uses the legal term "individual," which does **not** differentiate between adults and minors. An "individual" legally refers to citizens of all ages—nullifying parents' rights to stop their children from making harmful decisions.



2. ALLOW ABORTION THROUGH NINE MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In the case "Doe v. Bolton," the court defined "health" to include physical, emotional, psychological, familial, and the woman's age, allowing for abortion without limits in the proposed amendment.



3. ENSHRINE THE "RIGHT" TO SEX-CHANGE SURGERY AND HORMONES FOR MINORS

The initiative would enshrine protections for anything involving "reproductive decisions." This would include gender transition "therapy" like hormones and irreversible surgeries.



4. ENABLE ABUSERS

Any "person" that "assists" an "individual," including a minor, in getting an abortion or sex change would now be legally protected in doing so. This includes an adult man abusing a teenage girl or a teacher going behind a parent's back.





[The truth is that abortion is already legal in Ohio and it will continue to be legal regardless of the outcome of this election. The question facing voters is whether it will be radicalized.]

FULL TEXT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Be it Resolved by the People of the State of Ohio that Article I of the Ohio Constitution is amended to add the following Section:

Article I, Section 22. The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- A. Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on:
 - 1. contraception;
 - 2. fertility treatment;
 - continuing one's own pregnancy;
 - 4. miscarriage care; and
 - 5. abortion.
- B. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either:
 - 1. An individual's voluntary exercise of this right or
 - 2. A person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right,

unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.

However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.

- C. As used in this Section:
 - "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis."
 - 2. "State" includes any governmental entity and any political subdivision.
- D. This Section is self-executing.

The Rosary Group meets to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm in the church. This Wednesday, they will pray the special "Rosary for Life" intentions.

Each Monday, St. Peter Parish participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm. Those going to the Preterm abortion facility leave at 11:15 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot. Those praying at St Peter Church meet at the church at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.
