## 28<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



They were exceedingly astonished and said among themselves, "Then who can be saved?" Jesus looked at them and said, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." - Mk 10:26-27

Dear Parishioners,

Last summer the Diocese of Cleveland sponsored priests, deacons, women and men religious, and laity to participate in the National Eucharistic Congress. Their purpose in sponsoring these individuals to participate in this Congress was to raise up Eucharistic Revival missionaries. In other words, empowered by this amazing event, these people are to witness to their experience of this event with the eye of inviting people back to a weekly participation in the Eucharistic celebration.

There were a number of parishioners from St. Julie and St. Peter parishes, including myself, that participated in the historic five-day conference that took place at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, IN. In pondering ways to be Eucharistic Revival Missionaries, a number of participants from St. Peter and St. Julie Parishes met and planned a five-hour retreat day. The basic information about the retreat is in the bulletin.

This retreat will try to capture the flavor of the national event. And though everything will be scaled back quite a bit (St. Peter gym will not hold 50,000 people), Jesus Christ will be present there. What more could you ask for!

I do encourage you to block out Saturday, November 9 and participate in this short retreat. Most of us can use a faith boost. We want to encounter Jesus more deeply, understand Him more fully and live for Him more boldly. I believe that this mini-retreat day will recharge our spiritual batteries and help each of us to be Eucharist missionaries. **All are welcome.**

The gospel today is often referred to as the *rich young man*. Though we are reading from Mark's gospel, the description of this man as *young* comes from Matthew 19:20. This passage of scripture challenges us in a number of ways. **The first challenge is to our faith.** When this man addresses Jesus, he refers to him as *Good teacher*. Jesus responded, *Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone.* Though the point is not elaborated on, I believe that Jesus was asking him, *Are you acknowledging me as God?* In light of the rest of the gospel, I hope that we can say *Yes* to that inferred question.

**This gospel also challenges us and our behavior.** Keeping the commandments is not an option. However, we need to continually strive to live out the commandments of the Lord. To break the commandments is to step out of bounds. Keeping them keeps us in the game. Thank God for the Sacrament of Penance that puts us back on the playing field if we flub up.

**The finally, the gospel challenges us to be detached from our stuff.** Though most of us have vocations that mandate that we have a certain amount of stuff (parents, those in the work force, et cetera), Christ needs to be first and Lord of our stuff. It is easy to forget that. We can easily end up possessed by our possessions.

**These challenges are not arbitrary. In our gospel reading, St. Mark recorded that Jesus...loved him.** Because Jesus loves us, he invites us to believe in him, obey him, and trust him with our stuff. If we do so, our following of Jesus Christ becomes an adventure, not a religious punch list.





## Week 3 Update

**During the first two weeks of the 40 Days for Life Fall Campaign, there were 31 babies saved from abortion! (that we know of) Our prayers are being answered! Please continue to pray every day.**

**As we pray for an end to abortion, we also need to pray for those who have experienced abortion.** “Serena” tells her story:

*I was taken for an abortion at the age of 13 after being sexually assaulted. My parents were devastated and looking for help and the only help that was offered was an abortion. I had never heard the word abortion before and had no idea what it was. Once in the clinic, I was separated from my parents.*

*The only thing I remember them talking about was a clump of cells. I had no idea what they were talking about. The abortion was painful and my mom listened to me screaming only to be told she couldn't help me. That resulted in her being put in a psych ward for two weeks.*

*My dad had to carry his bloody daughter over his shoulder out of the clinic and we wanted to forget that day. My family fell apart after the abortion. The abortion would follow me into my marriage and almost cost me everything including my life. I felt so unworthy to be a mother and a wife. I didn't even know I was allowed to grieve.*

*I had been told that abortion would fix my rape, but the abortion was worse than the rape. I couldn't help what someone did to me but it's a heavy weight to carry knowing you were part of ending a life. I turned to so many things to numb my pain.*

*One night I had an encounter where God saw me as a broken woman who was abortion wounded and lavished me in His love. After over 30 years of pain and suffering, I'm healed and free! God has turned my pain into purpose. I now can tell Elliana Grace's story to give her dignity and help other women around the world heal. I praise God for his grace. This is why I'm silent no more.*


