

Dear Parishioners,

One of the best ways to prepare to renew one's baptismal promises on Easter it to celebrate devoutly the Sacrament of Penance. Many people did just that last Wednesday at the Diocesan wide Evening of Confession. I am grateful to God for being able to share the forgiveness and mercy of Jesus Christ with the many people who participated in this event at St. Peter and St. Julie Parish.

Our parishes, St. Peter and St. Julie, have another opportunity next Sunday, March 10. We will gather at 3:00 p.m. in the afternoon at St. Peter Parish for a communal celebration Sacrament of Penance. Jesus thought that this sacrament was so important that on the evening of that first Easter, when Jesus appeared to his apostles, He breathed the Holy Spirit upon them and said, Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained. If you have not yet gone to confession, I hope to see you next weekend. There will be plenty of priests to assist our parishes that afternoon.

Last week I gave a pitch for anyone else who wanted to join the Discovering Christ program. A few people accepted the offer and there are now 34 people who are signed up. I pray that the people can experience what the title of the program describes: a deeper and personal discovery of Jesus Christ.

I am also edified by the people who are participating in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesdays afternoon (2:00-5:00 p.m.). This oasis of silent prayer can refresh one's soul. Many people come for an hour. Some people make a short visit. Either way, the Lord is pleased with our presence adoring His Presence. Last week, one ninety-year-old woman rolled in with her walker to St. Peter's adoration on Tuesday afternoon on her way to pick up her medications at a local pharmacy. She prayed for a few minutes and continued on her way. God bless her!

I am also encouraged by the reports I get from Fr. Isidore about Stations of the Cross on Fridays at Noon. Again, this is a way for us to deepen our love of the Lord as we witness how great his love is for us.

Our readings this week highlight both the spiritual problem and solution of life. The problem, simply put, is sin. And the solution is clearly Jesus Christ Himself!

Last week I was teaching religion to the sixth graders at St. Peter School. They were reviewing the Ten Commandments (not the movie but the real commandments!) This is today's first reading from the Book of Exodus. In my teaching, I emphasized that these Commandments are good. They highlight natural law. They resonate with our conscience. They frame a way of life that leads to greater peace in society.

However, I also spoke of the fact that we have an interior tendency to break them!

Sixth graders do not always treat their parents with respect! They do not always jump on their homework, embrace their chores with cheerfulness, and sometimes lie! Why do they (and all of us) break or neglect these good commandments?

We are infected by original sin. Though forgiven in baptism and the Sacrament of Penance, the tendency toward self-love remains. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, quoting the Vatican II Council document, The Church in the Modern World, put it this way:

The whole of man's history has been the story of our combat with the powers of evil, stretching, so our Lord tells us, from the very dawn of history until the last day. Finding himself in the midst of the battlefield man has to struggle to do what is right, and it is at great cost to himself, and aided by God's grace, that he succeeds in achieving his own inner integrity. (CCC #409)

Thank God for Christ! In our second reading St. Paul proclaims the power and the wisdom of the cross of Jesus Christ. Through it we are forgiven. By the cross, and the gift of the Holy Spirit that God lavishes upon us, we learn to die to our self-love and develop holy habits (virtue) by which we do the good God created us to do.

During this Lent, may the Lord, who desires us to be His clean and holy temple (today's gospel), lead us along a path of truth, goodness, and beauty. We want to reflect God's plan revealed in Jesus.

Meet at the St. Julie large parking lot at 11:15am. Or, if you can't make it to Planned Parenthood, you can pray with fellow parishioners in the church, also on Thursday from 12noon to 1pm.

The Rosary Group meets to pray the Rosary each Wednesday at 1:00pm in the church followed by Eucharistic Adoration in the church from 2-5pm.

Each Monday, St. Peter Parish participates in 40 Days for Life by praying from Noon to 1pm. Those going to the Preterm abortion facility leave at 11:15 AM from the St. Peter front parking lot. Those praying at St Peter Church meet at the church at Noon and end at 1:00 PM.
