

From the desk of Fr. Bob...

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend was my first time back at St. Julie Parish celebrating Mass. I enjoyed meeting you and getting reacquainted with many of you. Fr. Isidore and I will be more present here in the days to come. Beginning the weekend of January 7-8, we will be celebrating all the weekend Masses at St. Julie Parish. In order to better serve the people of St. Julie Parish, and really our surrounding area, Fr. Isidore and I will begin celebrating weekday Masses at St. Julie Parish beginning Monday, January 2, at 5:30 p.m. We will celebrate Mass in the church on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 5:30 p.m. We hope this early evening time will accommodate those who want to attend Mass during the week but were not able to do so due to work commitments. More information will be forthcoming.

On a personal note, last weekend Fr. Isidore and I attended a unique party. Priests from around the diocese gathered at St. John Bosco for an "Ordo" burning party. An Ordo is a small book that is published annually that lists all the liturgical rites and options for the liturgical year. The 2022 liturgical year ended on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, and we began the new year last weekend with the vigil Mass for the First Sunday of Advent. We all brought our used Ordos and threw them into a bonfire.

Besides being a nice gathering for priests, it was a good way start afresh. Out with the old and in with the new. May the Lord bless us all as we delve more deeply into the 2023 liturgical year.

This Thursday, December 8, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses on Thursday are at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Among the Solemnities that are Holy Days of Obligation, this day has a particular importance for Catholics in the United States. The bishops of the United States voted unanimously on May 13, 1846 to make Mary, conceived without sin, the Patroness of the United States. This was approved by Pope Pius IX the next year. May our gathering to celebrate this feast this week honor our Lady and, and through her intercession, bring God's mercy and grace to our land.

Next Sunday, December 11, at 7:00 p.m., St. Peter Parish will be hosting our annual joint Advent Penance Service with St. Julie Parish. All are welcome to gather at St. Peter Parish to respond to the call of St. John the Baptist to repent of our sins, and make ready our lives for the coming of the Lord Jesus. Cont'd

Second Sunday of Advent

Finally, today's readings outline how we are to prepare for the coming of the Lord. St. John the Baptist summons us to turn away from sin and hypocrisy and return to the Lord. Isaiah the prophet describes, in a way that is both poetic and prophetic, the transformation that will take place when repentant people welcome the Messiah. Natural enemies (the cow and the lion, the child and the adder) will be reconciled. This transformation will be possible because the Messianic people will share in the Spirit of the Messiah: a Spirit of wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, fear of the Lord, and wonder and awe at God's presence.

May our Advent devotions and practices open us to a deeper encounter with the Lord and a fuller experience of His Holy Spirit.
